What is a Cult?

Question: What is the definition of a cult?

Answer: A cult is a person or group of people that misleads people concerning <u>who</u> Jesus is and <u>what</u> He did.

They will distort the person of Christ—denying that He is God in the flesh, or the work of Christ—denying that He completely paid for our salvation on the cross..

Here are some signs on how to identify a cult:

- Cults will deny that Jesus is God in the flesh. They will claim that He is just a man, a prophet, an angel, a god, one of many gods, or the son of God but not God.
- Cults say that Jesus did not complete the work of salvation through His death on the cross. They will teach that you must do something (like go door-to-door passing out booklets) in order to gain your salvation.
- Cults will add extra books to the Bible, or take away from the Bible. The Mormons add the Book
 of Mormon to the Bible and the Jehovah's Witnesses make significant changes and mistranslates
 words with their New World Translation—removing the deity of Christ and changing other major
 doctrines.
- Cults claim they are the only way to God. They teach that you must be a member of their sect to receive approval from God.
- Cults use mind control or pressure to keep their members. This is why you usually see them traveling in pairs. One will report on the other if he or she wavers from what their cult teaches.
