## Missions

If you were asked about the history of Christmas For Kids, could you list the current committee members? Could you name the people who have so generously served in the past to keep this program going? Over the years, these people have planned, questioned, organized, and worked incredible hours insuring each child receives gifts for Christmas. Could you tell the number of volunteers who love to go shopping?

First of all the answer to the last one is that it is impossible to count. Our current committee members are **Janie Williams, Dick Smith, Dennis and Cathy Breitholtz** with help from the previous chairman - *Mark Suckow* and his wife *Marla*. But did you remember *Bob* and *Sherlene Schmidt* served in this role from 2005 to 2009? Before that *Steve Lee* and *Ingrid Krumdick* took over leadership from *Foster Udell*. Ingrid commented that Foster was extremely helpful. I spoke with Jo Reichling who worked with Ingrid plan for the shopping. She jokingly said Ingrid wouldn't do any speaking in church so she and Steve divided up the tasks - he would do the speaking and she would shop. This was agreeable with both of them. In the early days

only NLS was on the list and then Mercer. Jo remembers one of her first kids was a young man whose only desire was 'anything with Green Bay Packers' on it. I don't think times have changed! Cooperation with Mercer and NLS has been essential to this program and this year the children at Camp Jorn have been added.

But the real question is - Why do we do this? Why do we ask for your money? There are many children in this local area who will not have the opportunity to receive gifts unless MWCC is involved. This is our chance to say "We do Care!" *Envelopes have been placed in the pews for donations and you will hear people asking for help to shop.* The financial goal is approximately \$7,000 which to many may seem excessive but stop and think about the great need. This will be your opportunity to help our local children. There are groups within our church who provide a portion of this money but Mission Committee and Christmas for Kids are also asking for your individual help.

## 2013 CHRISTMAS FOR KIDS UPDATE

The work of identifying families and their children has been done. At the time I am writing this update we have identified 59 kids and 28 families who could use our help to make their Christmas special. (More may be added since this count.) So far the break down is 33 children 14 families from North Lakeland, 3 children and 2 families from Camp Jorn's YMCA Childcare Center, and 23 children and 11 families from Mercer. Last year from these populations we served 42 children from 18 families, creating an increase this year of 16 children and 10 families.

We need your help more than ever if we are going to meet this need. We could use more shoppers and obviously we need more contributions. To provide a little help in the holidays to families who need to feel there are folks in their community willing to reach out is truly a great gift of Christ's love.

Our plans are to provide shopping materials to shoppers on **November 10<sup>th</sup>**. This would give shoppers a good five weeks to gather their gifts.

*We would like to thank all of you who have given, and ask those of you who have not to please consider this opportunity to support your community.* We leave you with this verse from Acts 20 verse 35: "I have shown you all things, how that so laboring ye ought to support the weak, and to remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

## **Westminster Guild**

Lots of news to report in this issue, starting with our very successful Cluster Gathering, for which we were the host church on October 3, 2013. Twenty-nine women, including representatives from Lac du Flambeau and Ashland, as well as our own MWPCP, gathered for a wonderful time of worship, delicious food, and fellowship. The program was highlighted by *Janie Williams'* presentation on her experiences doing mission work in Guatemala, through the Pure Vida organization. Janie is preparing for her third visit to Guatemala next March, but her experience in missions dates back to 1997, when she and her husband Bill were commissioned by the Ironwood Presbyterian church for work in Peru, where Bill's job was taking them. While there, Bill led weekly worship services and Janie conducted Sunday school classes for children in the community! In Guatemala, Janie has been involved in various projects, including building schools and houses(!), and she would love to tell you more about them. Just stop and chat with her after church some Sunday.

At our meeting on October 17<sup>th</sup>, we began this year's Bible Study, led by *Father Bill Radant*. Entitled "An Abiding Hope: The Presence of God in Exodus and Deuteronomy," the study helps us to understand these Hebrew Scriptures "through a Christian lens." These writings are important to us because: 1) they tell the earliest of God's acts of salvation; 2) our church's own story comes from this history and must be understood in that light; and 3) these were Jesus' scriptures, from which He taught. Our study is already VERY interesting, providing much stimulation discussion, which we most sincerely invite you to join!

During the "business part of our October 17<sup>th</sup> meeting, we voted to fund the purchase of two new bells for our bell choir and the framing of a beautiful stained glass window, which we received from the Bessemer church upon its closing.

As we begin to think about the holiday season, we ask that you consider the **Winnebago Mental Health Institute** in your giving. These patients are often "forgotten," and we can so easily help with simple gifts, such as: socks, shampoo, body wash, wallets/coin purses, chocolates (small and large bars), gift cards (Wal-Mart, Target, Shopko, etc.), phone cards (60 or 120 minutes), men's and women's winter hats/gloves, "forever" postage stamps, etc. A complete list is available near the box in the narthex, where we will be collecting these items. Please keep these people in your thoughts as you prepare for the holidays!

## “Planning our Garden”

*Sissinghurst* is a story about the beautiful English country gardens planted by Vita Sackville-West and her husband, Harold Nicholson, in the early 1930's. Two sections of this book about gardens can teach us lessons about our own lives. These two sections are: “The Plan,” and “The War Years.” Nicholson spent the better part of a year planning and laying out the basic shape of the garden before a single flower or shrub was planted, and his philosophy of gardening was to have a plan and to stick to it until he discovered a particular plant could not survive where it was planted. In seven years, the garden was spectacular, but the following “War Years” left the garden falling into disarray. Before Nicholson left for military service, their head gardener wrote the following advice: Look after the yew rows and trees. If all else fails, we can begin again, but we cannot restore those if they are ruined. It was the yew rows and trees that gave the plan “shape” to the eye. They were the markers by which the basic structure and plan of the garden could be seen and best appreciated. Without them, the garden would have been just a sea of beautiful flowers, and it would be too much for the mind's eye to take in and appreciate.

Our lives are like Nicholson's gardens in one important sense: if we fail to plan adequately, we lose track of the markers and basic outline of our lives, and the varied details begin to merge as one. The demarcation between work and recreation disappears for us. The commitment to our family can merge with the demands of our work and one or the other, or both begin to suffer. Psychologists and service professionals speak of the need for boundaries in our lives. I think we need a clear demarcation separating various aspects of our lives. In the first of the two creation stories in the book of Genesis, the poet separates the creation of each day with a repeating refrain: “And there was evening and there was morning, ... This poetic framing device reminds us: “It is not good for man/woman” to live 24/7 lives. Without breaks, and markers, our lives will merge into an incomprehensible sea of activity, without goals, or direction. In the planning of our lives, clear breaks and times of rest and renewal are needed; not only to separate the days, but to create the biological rhythms needed for mental, emotional, relation and spiritual health. May each of us become better stewards in planning the boundaries necessary to create a healthy, clearly delineated spiritual garden filling our lives with the rhythms needed for our health and wholeness.
