

Someone (usually Ken Carlson) sets up tables and chairs for the 100 expected guests.

Karen Fetting, Kitchen Sister for Funerals, has already planned, shopped, and prepared some of the food.



9:00 AM – Pastor Paul greets the funeral directors as they arrive with the casket and flowers.

The lunch ladies arrive, ready to start cooking. Today we're using pork and ham for meat, since they're on sale. Olive Bjugstad has been offering the opportunity to bring salads and cookies, providing variety and a tangible expression of sympathy to the family. Bob and Brenda Lindner bring cookies to add to those already left on the counter.





10:30 AM – Karen Fowler sets out the table center mats and baskets of salt, pepper, sugar and creamers.

These women represent **many** others who faithfully come to make a meal when needed.


12:00 - Lunch is served
