# Sermon Questions 10-4-2015

## "Prayer and the Character of God"

#### **Main Point**

We are now moving into a new series on prayer, yet this in many ways is an extension of our "worship" series. Just as worship is a response to God, so is prayer. Just as worship is a response of the heart, so is prayer. Much of worship culminates itself in the form of prayer. When it comes to prayer we must understand the source and foundation of the power of prayer, before we can say we are powered by prayer.
