#### Dear MAG Family,

When I think about the opportunity I have to work alongside you all at MAG, I am so blessed and humbled. Every day, every week, I am blessed by your encouragement, your generosity, how you care for, pray for, and honor me and my family. I am unworthy, yet at the same time, I am extremely grateful and realize how blessed I am You have made these past 7 years such a joy for me and Cheri. I can't tell you how much I enjoy serving the Lord in ministry together with you.

Every pastor's vision for their church is that we try to provide a place for people to fulfill their calling, and when a need arises at MAG, so many people rise to the occasion. I'm grateful for the pastoral team with which God has bless us! Their willingness to pitch in sacrificially and serve at a moment's notice, to preach the Word of God! I am grateful for our Church Council who sacrifice so much of their time and energy that most of us never see! I am grateful for the many who work in the youth and children's ministries areas, Girls' Ministry, Royal Rangers, the doorkeepers who faithfully welcome people into the church, the worship team, the Sunday School team, Connect Group facilitators, ushers, the people who set up refreshments & clean up, all our ministry leaders and their awesome teams. It's so good.

There is also much going on behind the scenes. I love it when I hear people planning to go to lunch after church or groups getting together to hang out or fellowship. I can't tell you how many times I've gone to visit someone in the hospital or nursing home, and I'm not the first person there. That makes me smile. With God's help we plan, this year, to expand our foyer (essentially doubling its size), to re-carpet our facility (the current carpeting is over 20 yrs. old—plus, you may have noticed the fading and the growing areas of packing tape repairs 3), and finalize and reveal our plans for the enlargement of our sanctuary 3. We will keep you well informed along the way! In the mean time, **THANK YOU FOR YOUR FAITHFULNESS TO THE LORD.** 

Let me close with this one thought: **Jesus loves you!** He has always, and He will always! He treasures you. He has a calling for your life, an adventure for you. #### WISDOM KEEPERS' MESSAGE

In 2014 MAG Wisdom Keepers strengthened old relationships and built new ones. Our focus was creating ministries that would unite our church community. Several new ministries were created to bridge the gap between generations and denominations.

In January, a MAG Master Gardeners' committee was formed to supervise the construction of a raised vegetable garden. The Women's Visitation Team continued their visits to local nursing homes, hospitals and shut-ins. Wisdom Keepers living at Massey Park Apartments began a weekly non-denominational bible study for residents there.

In February and March, plans for building and planting a spring garden progressed. In February, Dr. Pam Jason taught a gardening workshop on building miniature greenhouses for early seed planting.

In March, Wisdom Keepers enjoyed a Gospel Sing Night and exchanged their greenhouse garden plants with one another.

In April, we traveled to the Japanese Stroll Gardens and the Nathaniel Green Park in Springfield. After lunch there, we visited the Precious Moments Chapel near Carthage.

Wisdom Keepers attended a 50+ retreat at Cross Pointe in May. Later that month, we traveled to the Baker Creek Seed Company. There we visited a replica of a village from the 1800's, ate at a Vegan restaurant and bought a variety of heirloom seeds. Also in May, our MAG Drama Team comprised of Wisdom Keepers, middle-agers and teenagers was formed. Wisdom Keepers helped to plant, water and harvest our new church garden throughout the summer.

In June, we toured Wisdom Keepers' flower and vegetable gardens. Later that month, we had a night out at Sheila's Place. In July, we hosted our second annual ice cream blast. And in August, we held our first dinner theater, catered by the MAG youth.

In September, we fished and enjoyed a bonfire at Harry and Dorine Ledgerwood's. In October, we started a Wisdom Keepers' prayer meeting before Sunday school. We traveled to the Stained Glass Theater and enjoyed a Thanksgiving meal at Sheila's Place in November.

In December, we formed an In-Touch Ministry to reach out to the homebound and a Crockpot Ministry to provide hot meals for our seniors. We also began a women's weekly prayer meeting. At Christmas, we sang Christmas carols to the residents of Webco Manor and hosted a Christmas party at MAG.

## MARSHFIELD ASSEMBLY OF GOD MINUTES OF ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING FEBRUARY 26, 2014

**OPENING:** Pastor called meeting to order at 6:37 pm.

**WORSHIP/DEVOTIONAL:** Pastor led the congregation in reading Psalm 136. Steve Hunt led the body in singing *Great is Thy Faithfulness* and *Bless the Lord, O My Soul*.

**PRAYER:** Sister Lawley led in prayer for several urgent needs in our church body.

**ROSTER REPORT:** In order to conduct the business meeting, 34 members need to be present. Todd Revell reported that 52 were present with 35 needed for an election. A motion prevailed to accept the roster report as presented.

**MINUTES:** Jay White read the minutes from the February 27th, 2013 Annual Business Meeting. A motion prevailed to accept the minutes as read.

**FINANCIAL REPORT:** The Financial Report and 2014 Proposed Budget was presented by Renee Lawson and Steve Hunt. Discussion surrounded making the final mortgage payment on the church building within the next week. Steve reported that the Council will continue to set aside the allotted payment sum for future building projects and improvements. Discussion was also made regarding pastoral salaries. A motion prevailed to receive the financial report with appreciation.

**FINANCIAL AUDIT:** James Pekarek, chairman of the Financial Audit team, reported on the financial audit as called for in Article XI, Section 2, Annual Audit. James expressed appreciation to Steve Hunt, Renee Lawson, and the team members that served with him on this committee. James suggested that an updated inventory of the church's assets be taken. A motion prevailed to receive the report with appreciation.

**<u>DEACON NOMINATIONS</u>**: Kevin Murgel reviewed the results of the Deacon Nominating Team and requirements for deacon nominees. Melony Dennis and Louis Partney both agreed to serve if elected. Ballots were distributed.

**YOUTH PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Max Southern discussed the highlights of the MAG youth group's past year, with special mention of the growth in numbers and the moving of the Spirit among our teens.

**TELLER'S REPORT:** Todd Revell reported that Melony Dennis was elected to the church council.

**CLOSING REMARKS:** Steve Hunt mentioned that the books are always open to MAG church members at any time regarding financial numbers. Steve also mentioned that we were able to bless each of our missionaries with a \$500 bonus. The body was made aware that Pastor Sampley will be taking a one month paid sabbatical in 2014 per the Church Council.

**ADJOURNMENT**: Motion prevailed to adjourn the meeting with Robert Williams offering the prayer at 7:30 pm.

As a Committee, we had a suggestion we feel could benefit the Church Council and the Finance Team. The suggestion is for there to be in place a written description or procedure explaining the steps the Finance Team uses. This would be very informative should there be any substitute or alternates.

## MARSHFIELD ASSEMBLY OF GOD Deacon Nominating Committee Minutes January 25, 2015

**Attendance –** Those present were Pastor Sampley, Keith Colvin, Kevin Murgel, Teresa Revell.

**Reviewed the Duties and Qualifications of Deacons** per our Constitution and Bylaws. Pastor mentioned the importance of potential candidates fulfilling those requirements and the dignity of the office of deacon.

**Deacon Elections** – Pastor explained that of the five (5) deacons currently serving Marshfield Assembly of God on the Church Council: One (1) has one (1) year remaining on their second three-year term [Jay White], one (1) has one (1) year remaining on their first three-year term [Bob Collins], one (1) has two (2) years remaining on their first three-year term [Melony Dennis], one (1) has completed their first three-year term and is eligible to serve a second three years [Kevin Murgel], and one (1) has completed their second three-year term [Steve Hunt] and is required to rotate off of the Council for one year.

Since there are two (2) deacon vacancies available to be filled our goal is to submit at least two qualified candidate(s) to be considered by the Council and membership for these vacancies.

**Reviewed Membership List and Potential Candidates** – Committee recommendations were presented, and several members were considered as possible candidates. The committee was sent to approach these members and interview them in regards to their qualifications per the by-laws, and to their willingness to allow their names to be brought to the body for vote at the Annual Business Meeting scheduled for February 25, 2015. The Committee agreed to inform the pastor of their response and decide if any further action was needed.

**Adjournment -** Pastor Sampley closed in prayer.

<u>Update</u> – After receiving nominations and contacting all members who were nominated, four agreed to serve the congregation in the two deacon vacancies if elected. The following names were agreed upon as faithful, qualified, and willing to serve: Kevin Murgel, John Martin, Harry Ledgerwood, and Karen Gore. These names were submitted to the Council and approved for presentation as deacon candidates at the Annual Business Meeting, February 25, 2015.
