Presider

Blessed are You, God of Resurrection. From the beginning of all things, You create new life. Wonderful are You, Holy One, Who gives us eyes to see, and ears to hear. Holy are You, Faithful One, who gives us hearts with which to love. Tender are You, God of new life, who calls us to be Your servants.

Voice 1

Though we stumble, You pick us up. When we lose our way, You do not abandon us. Again and again, You call us back to You, raising us up to new life. Your promise of resurrection is food for our souls, an infusion of hope, a voice speaking in our hearts, a lamp for our feet when we cannot see our way. Voice 3

We thank You, tender and nurturing God, for walking with us on the path of life, for being present to us despite evil, adversity and fear. We thank You for making us partners in Your enterprise of love.

Voice 4

We thank You for the gift of Jesus, Your Anointed, who shows us Who-You-Are, and who we are, and what You want us to become.

And we remember the gift that Jesus gave, how he gathered with his friends on the night before he died, to share a final, Passover meal.

[Please extend your hand, palm up, toward the bread and wine.]

Presider

And so, Resurrecting One, we praise You through Jesus. We recognize Your Spirit alive and at work in this bread and wine, and in us. We open ourselves to Your Spirit who sanctifies and transforms these gifts to become You in us, the body and blood of Christ. We remember that...

All:

...on the night before Jesus died, while at supper with his friends, he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to them saying: "Take this, all of you and eat. This is my body. Do this in memory of me."

[Pause]

In the same way, Jesus took the cup filled with wine. He said the blessing, gave the cup to his friends, and said, "Take this all of you and drink. This is my blood. Do this in memory of me."

Presider Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: [Sung] Tompkins

We remember you. We remember you.

Jesus whose love lives in us, rising in our hearts.

Voice 5

Let Your Spirit also come upon all leaders secular and religious. Let Your spirit of *peace* come upon those who claim political power. Let Your spirit of *creativity and openness* come upon those who claim religious authority. Catch all of them by surprise. Fill their hearts with a longing for equality and justice. Imbue them with the joy of divine diversity. Bestow on them the wealth of humble service to others. Make them faithful servants of the body of Christ.

Be with those who are sick and those who suffer. Be with all who have died. Be with us in our struggling attempts to be Your faithful daughters and sons. Be with us as we seek to do Your work. With the help of Jesus, strengthen us to live lives that bring You honor and glory:
