Riches from Richard

The Apostle Paul wrote, "and do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2) Jesus said, "You are not of the world, but I choose you out of the world." (John 15:19) So often we have thought that worldliness consisted of drinking, smoking, movies, dancing, length of hair, etc. But the worldliness that Paul and Jesus speak about is much more comprehensive. It includes motives, goals, attitudes and methods.

Many congregations have adopted the world's system for leadership. The world speaks of people under or over someone else. The structure of big business has often been the pattern for church leadership. God's plan for leadership is far different. Jesus said, "But the greatest among you shall be your servant." (Matthew 23:11)

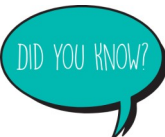
Another example of worldliness in the church is how we measure the effectiveness of church. "Bigness" is for many the ultimate measure of a congregation. There is nothing particularly spiritual about a small congregation, nor is quantity the ultimate measure in God's eyes. Let me challenge you to read the prayer of Jesus in John 17. Please note these things Christ prays would be evident in lives of believers (the church). They are not things we commonly use as a measurement of effective ministry. The message of Jesus Christ to the Seven Churches in Revelation 2 and 3 indicates those things that are important to the Lord. (Love, service, work, correcting false teaching, etc.)

One of the reasons why more people are not responding to the Gospel of Jesus Christ is that the Church doesn't look much different from the world. The world looks at the Church and fails to see the real necessity of following Jesus Christ. We are different, for we are "a chosen race, a Royal Priesthood, a Holy Nation, a people for God's own possession." (1 Peter 2:9)

When I was a kid growing up in this church, I knew we had ladies at the church who were called deaconesses, because my mom was one. Board Splinters

Elders: Mike Brand reported that the Elders are discussing Paul Weber's Ordination which will be in the spring.

Deaconesses: Dolo Wishard reported 1 funeral dinner in January and a big thank you to the ladies who tidy-up the sanctuary on Thursdays.

Minister: Max Betty has agreed to count the church attendance with Billie Connelly as a back-up, all ministries are doing well and we have a lot to offer at both services and the 5th Sunday services have brought unity and inspiration.

Associate Minister: Steve Morgan reported that they took 15 kids to the Winter Jam Concert in St. Louis on January 28th; held a Super Bowl Party at the Wishard's with 40 people attending; took 15 students to an EIU basketball game on February 11th; started a new curriculum for youth lessons from the organization *Sticky Faith*—lessons deal with tough questions students ask about God, Jesus, and their own faith; and small group meetings going well — topics so far are: fitness, language and fear.

Elementary Minister: Stephanie Anderson reported that in Mid-Week Outlet Mike Brand will teach in February and she will be teaching in March, she completed the hospice training program and helped the Outreach Committee fill backpacks.

Worship: Jan Kepley reported they are planning for Easter: the chancel choir will perform a mini-musical on Palm Sunday at both services; they will have a Good Friday Service at noon on April 14th; and on Easter Sunday we will have a Sunrise Service at 7 am, Breakfast from 8-9 am as a youth fundraiser and one service at 9:30 am.

Outreach: Candy Tate reported that they will collect the Easter Offering on April 9 and 16 for Camp New Hope, a local church will not participate in the BackPack Program next school year and they also need a new director for the program, and with the money from World Outreach they will add \$200 to PADS, Food Center and Catholic Charities accounts with the remaining money going into Authorized.

Evangelism: Debi Buford reported that articles to announce new staff members Steve Morgan and Julia Whitmore have been in the newspaper, new pens have been ordered, ads for the Singles Group will be on the radio and Steve Morgan will submit a "Did you Know?" section for the newsletter.

Stewardship: Dan Cunningham reviewed the Balance Sheet and Income Statements and felt positive about the 2016 finish.

Personnel: Jack Browning reported they had 2 meetings for evaluations with staff and all job descriptions are up to date except Dolo's who answers to the Trustees and working more on Steve Morgan's.

Seniors Minister: Richard Eident reported they had 26 in attendance (16 during the day and 10 in the evening) to watch the "Noah" movie, will schedule another movie time soon and will be going to Yoder's for lunch on February 21st at 11 am.
