If you want to create a Something More life, then you will need to add Something More elements to every day of your life.

It comes down to the actions you take.

Now, mastering your thought life is important, there's no question about it.

Taking control of your tongue and speaking the word of faith in every situation is important, no question about it.

Filtering out the garbage and filling your mind with uplifting, Spirit-filled content every day is important, no question about it.

1. Define for yourself an ever-increasing minimum, and follow it every day. MDR Minimum Daily Requirement

If you want to create the something more lifestyle, it begins with defining the minimum daily requirement of what you want your life to be: in your prayer life, your marriage, your work, your health, and on and on.

2. Act first and let your feelings catch up with you.

When your feelings aren't cooperating, you go ahead and take those first few feeble steps of obedience anyway, and eventually your feelings will catch up with you.

Think of the most debilitating feeling of all: fear. You cannot afford to wait for the feelings of fear to go away before you start to act, because they'll most likely never go away ... until you take action.

3. Do something today that isn't about today.

Your life is not just a collection of random facts. It is a story. It's going somewhere. And every page of your life needs to move in the direction that you want the story to go. For this reason we need to make sure that every day we're preparing ourselves for the direction we want our lives to take. Ref: James 2:26
