Some Radical Truths Jesus Taught Us about Sin
#1 We Better Take Sin S
Jesus said radical things about taking sin seriously and to do whatever we have to do for two reasons:
A. To keep from influencing others to sin. Ref: Matthew 18:6,7
B. Jesus said when it comes to sin get r Do whatever it takes. Take sin seriously, get radical to avoid it. Avoid willful transgressions of God's law. Ref: Matthew 13:41
#2 Treat Sinners G and with Respect
And if you asked Jesus, why do you hang out with sinners? He would admit that he was on a search and rescue mission for sinners. Ref: Mark 2:17
Jesus consistently taught his disciples to treat sinners with grace. There were two reasons:
A. Our own need for forgiveness precludes any of us from having the right to judge others.
One reason we need to treat sinners with grace is because that is exactly what we need from God. Ref: Matthew 6:14,15

This is a mystery, it's hard to understand, that God who hates sin, absolutely desires with a passion, to be reunited with sinners. Ref: Luke 15:7
