Happy 500th!

On the 31st of October 1517, an obscure Roman Catholic monk, and professor of biblical studies at the University of Wittenberg, Germany, named Martin Luther, nailed 95 Theses (talking points) to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. These talking points touched off a firestorm in the religious community that resulted in Luther's excommunication (he was "booted out"!) from the church.

Luther essentially protested errors and abuses by the religious hierarchy, specifically focused on the sale of indulgences, a kind of "buy your way out of purgatory" scheme devised to raise money for the massive church construction program in Europe. Luther went so far as to challenge the authority of the Pope, who claimed the power to "shut the gates of hell and open the doors to paradise." He believed that indulgences took the focus off of God and placed it upon human effort, and he could find no Scriptural support for this practice.

We, in the Presbyterian Church, are products of the movement that Luther spawned, which became known as the "Protestant Reformation," from the words, "protest" and "reform." Three traditions emerged: Lutherans in Germany and Scandinavia; Zwinglians, and Calvinists in Switzerland, France, Holland, and Scotland; and the Church of England.

After a long spiritual crisis, Luther came to understand through his study of the Scriptures, the nature of God's righteousness, and he rejected any theology based solely on human tradition. He emphasized personal experience and understanding of God's Word. Luther's legacy is the authority of Scripture and the centrality of the Gospel of God's grace to our salvation, as opposed to human achievement. Luther was the first to translate the Bible into German, the language of the people; and with the invention of the printing press by Johann Gutenberg in 1456, the Bible could be placed in the hands of the masses, who were "hungry" for God's Word.

Perhaps as we observe the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation this month we can reflect on this rich heritage of faith we so easily take for granted – humbly giving thanks to God for God's amazing grace; and renewing our desire for reading and understanding God's Word.

September 20, 2017
