FALL SERMON SERIES UPDATE BY REV. JUSTIN AMSLER

"Who is Jesus" Investigating Jesus' claims about himself in the Book of John

This fall our sermon series will be focused on the Question: "Who is Jesus?" We are going to answer that question together, largely from Jesus' own words. In the book of John, Jesus makes many "I AM" statements. But there are seven key ones that we will be investigating to find a fuller answer to the question, "Who is Jesus?" Equally as important as who Jesus is, is what he expects of us. As we learn more about our loving father we will learn more about how we can respond to his love and how we will come to know that he is our source and our life. The book of John is an adventure in faith and leads readers on a path of deeper and deeper knowledge of who this person of Jesus really is. Join with me in embarking on this journey to see what we can gain from examining closely the words of Jesus as recorded by John. The opening sermon to the series will begin this week, on Rally Day, August 29th.

CHRISTIAN BOOK AND RESOURCE REVIEW: THRIVING FAMILY MAGAZINE BY: SARAH AMSLER



As a new wife and mother I am the consumer of many magazines. Magazines that help me learn how to cook, creating a delectable meal in 30 minutes or less, and ones that tell me about new infant/toddler products and ones that of course give guidance to commonly asked questions like "What do I do when...? or other questions of life and parenting.

The next portion of the magazine is called "Family Media" covering anything from digital media to music, to book and movie reviews. "Family Faith" is the third section which includes an article with ideas for family devotions, memory verses, addressing key points in the chosen scripture and hands on activities that help promote learning and comprehension. One fun topic that I think is very useful is the "Dinner Talk" section which encourages family meal time and discussions. This section also provides additional scripture for weekly study. Under "Family Faith" are articles that share examples of how faith practices are worked on and worked out in real families' lives such as humility, self sacrifice, marriage building, and building neighborly community. Lastly, "Family Life" covers articles specifically for Men, Women, Moms, Working Mothers, Single parents, and extended family. I was impressed by how much of the material is written by popular Christian musicians and other well known church leaders.

This magazine is for parents of every age, whether you are a mom, dad, or grandparent there is something for you. Encouragement is needed to help our families thrive these days. In today's world broken families are a common reality and more families are finding themselves against odds. This magazine knows that your family may be less than ideal and supports you wherever you are. I am thankful there are resources out there by well acclaimed Christian groups to help us fight for our marriages and families. I highly recommend this magazine.
