

PASTOR'S PAGE -REV. JUSTIN AMSLER

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Philippians 4:6



This verse of Scripture was one of the first passages that I committed to memory as a child. I still remember that as a teen helper at my church's Vacation Bible School, I used this verse when asked to give a testimony before the nearly 200 children who were gathered in the sanctuary that day. My message to the children who were in the midst of a great week of VBS was that they had nothing to fear. They had God on their side and nothing could steal them away from his powerful love so long as they remained true to the commands of Jesus. The teaching is eternal and the reason I bring it out for our reflection this month is because we all have difficulty trusting God with our futures. We are chronic doubters and worriers.

We look to ourselves for answers rather than to Jesus Christ. Paul has a simple prescription to help us in our chronic weakness. Don't worry. It is that simple. The Spiritual health of a person can, in one way, be gauged by how well he or she is able to actually do this. Do we freely give our problems and our worries over to Jesus Christ? This is where the rubber meets the road so to speak. We can have mountains of head knowledge and decades of service to the church and again find ourselves not trusting Jesus the way we should. Our mission as followers of Jesus Christ is to give our burdens and our future to Jesus and let him take care of the details that we cannot. What drew me to this passage for us this month was not so much the command of "do not be anxious" but the method by which we are able to actually accomplish it. That method is prayer and thanksgiving. A perspective of thankfulness is essential to the follower of Jesus. It is one of the keys to finding peace in this life. Thanksgiving is one of those unique American holidays that is actually rooted in the Gospel. We as a people take time to give thanks and to re-orient ourselves to the goodness of God and to the abundance that he has provided us with. Take time this month to focus on prayer and to find that perspective of thanksgiving that goes beyond our words and sinks deeply into our hearts.

May Christ's Spiritual abundance be upon you all,


able to specialize in cleaning and maintenance projects that can be tackled on an every other week basis. Please greet Wally when you have a chance to meet him and welcome him into our
