#### A Season of New Birth

The Christmas Season is upon us and what a joy it is to transition from setting aside some time for family, friends, and our creator for our Thanksgiving holiday and then transitioning into our celebration of Christ's birth. We love the music and the decorations that surround the Christmas holiday because it draws us near to the Savior. We take some time to reflect on those wonderful birth narratives in the Gospels, recounting how the Savior of the world was not birthed into a royal palace surrounded by wealth

and luxury but was scandalously born to an unwed mother in an impoverished community.

The account reminds us how God can take our humble circumstances and bring forth something great for the glory of his Name and his Kingdom. As the Scripture says: "Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth." (I Cor. 1:26) Our Lord and Savior loves to rebuild and reform us into people who carry the very presence of God with us. He loves to see us come up from humble circumstances and become great for his kingdom. He loves to see his church revitalized and reenergized. He literally is a God of New Birth.

Sometimes I like to use the skeptical words of Nathaniel before he began to follow Jesus. He said: "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" Some may say to us: "Can anything good come from McDonald?" Or Midway, or Mercer, or name your favorite small town... The answer is a resounding yes! God brings forth amazing things from humble circumstances. That is just the way he is.

Maybe you are in a season of New Birth (I believe that we all are!). Perhaps God is calling you into a new responsibility or given you a new opportunity to live with impact through your family, a work opportunity, or a new relationship. Don't set aside what God has put in front of you. When he presents you with an open door don't turn your back on him. He will provide. He will give you opportunities to bless and be blessed. This holiday season cultivate a thankful heart and a readiness to be renewed and restored. It is our sinful nature that brings discouragement and hopelessness, it is the Spirit of God that brings confidence and hope in his promises and his Word. The Christmas season is ultimately about our response to the Savior's birth and how we will live our lives differently because he is born and He Lives!

Our treasure is not in this place. Our treasure is in heaven, let us remember that as so many things pull for our time and our resources may we always seek to invest in things that have eternal value.

### STEWARDSHIP PLEDGE DRIVE

Thank you to the many people who have already submitted a pledge card for the 2014 calendar year or will soon do so. While these pledge cards can guide us in setting our budget and our goals for 2014 they are best seen as a spiritual tool to help us make a decision about what amount we will be able to return to the Lord in faith this coming year. We should never be afraid to make a pledge because we may not be able to fulfill it. Only God himself knows our future. The pledge is simply our best estimate of what we will be able to give in the coming year and is an agreement between an individual or a family and God. Please be assured that all of our records are kept with proper confidentiality and care for your personal peace of mind and financial security. We are able to make our pledges freely knowing that our Lord is able to meet all of our needs.

#### **ECO ANNUAL DUES**

One of the advantages of realigning our congregation with ECO: A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians is that they have made a commitment to keep a minimal national and regional structure which allows for lower operating costs on the denominational level. In the past, we were assessed about \$33.00 per member each year and we paid that assessment whether or not the individual was able to cover their own expenses. This amounted to about \$9,000.00 annually. The new assessment is not member based but is set at 1% of budget which for us is less than \$2,500.00 annually. Because of this change our Session was able to cut our annual dues by more than two thirds. The per member share this year will be only \$10.00. We will joyfully contribute this amount to the work of our new and growing denomination. As opportunities unfold we likely will also participate in denominational mission projects and church planting endeavors. We now have 96 churches who have officially entered into membership in the ECO and many, many more are in process. Please pray that God would move powerfully among us as we endeavor to "do church" differently and reach more people with the message of
