Holy Week is an important week in the life of the church and, accordingly, we have a number of worship services and events that will be taking place. Details are listed below and continue on page 3. Set aside some time this Easter to worship our Living God, the Lord Jesus Christ.

PALM SUNDAY

On Sunday, March 20, we will be celebrating Palm Sunday with worship and palms in Calvary Center sanctuary. That day our children will have a special program at Trinity Center during the Sunday School hour where they will be doing a number of fun Easter activities.

MORNING PRAYER

Pastor Justin will be leading a time of Prayer at 9:00am in Trinity Center Sanctuary Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (March 21-23) to prepare our hearts to celebrate the death and resurrection of our Lord. We will begin and end with the singing of an Easter hymn and will meditate and pray together on the profound nature of what Christ has done. All are welcome and praying out loud is not required.

MAUNDY THURSDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE

At 7:30pm on Thursday, March 24, our congregation will gather in Calvary Center for a special service of worship in remembrance of the Last Supper and of Christ's death on the cross. As is fitting for this service, we will be celebrating Communion by coming forward, taking bread, and dipping it in the cup. This will be a powerful service that also includes music and Scripture readings that correspond to the extinguishing of candles throughout the service. By the end of the service the sanctuary will be dark, symbolizing the betrayal and death of Jesus Christ.

24 HOUR PRAYER VIGIL

From Friday, March 25 at 7:00pm until Saturday, March 26 at 7:00pm we will be holding a 24 hour Easter Prayer Vigil to take place in Trinity Sanctuary. Volunteers will sign up for different one hour slots and will take shifts praying throughout the day and night for 24 hours. The sign up sheet is located in Calvary's parlor. This prayer can be carried out by one, two, or a whole group of individuals at any particular time. When you arrive, there will be a prayer guide which will make it easy to continue praying and reading Scripture for the hour that you are present. A prayer vigil is a great way to be united as a church family and to open ourselves to the moving of God's Spirit.

Elections, Politics, and the Sovereignty of God

Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Romans 13:1

Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God. Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor. I Peter 2:16-17

In America today we are in the midst of a massive cultural shift. This shift can be described as a move from Christendom to Secularism. We are the proud inheritors of a culture largely shaped by those who were seeking to serve the Lord Jesus Christ at the highest levels of government and culture. At our founding, Europe was saturated with Christian thinking and the Bible had been the standard of morality for us and for many of our common ancestors for centuries. While there have been many differing opinions regarding the way our faith should be expressed, only rarely has the Word of God itself been rejected wholly and completely as a guiding document for those who choose to live well. This understanding of Christian values has formed a block of culture that has been called Christendom. The church has rightly benefited in this climate. It has received broad privileges from a society who understood at an intrinsic level that it was our faith in God and particularly in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord that was the basis of our civility and any blessing our nations might receive.

This culture has been maintained because at any given point in our history a majority of people have believed that they should live according to the voice of God. However, we are living in a moment that most of Europe has already experienced. Those in our culture who distrust the church and reject the claims of Christ have a very substantial voice that is seeking to become the majority position. Many missiologists and church leaders have declared Christendom to be dead and have perceived that a new age has begun. If trends continue, they will certainly be right. Some are celebrating but others mourn what could be lost and what has already slipped away.

As Christ followers today we need to be prepared for whatever our future may be. We pray and work towards revival and seek out leaders who will guide our nation according to the way of Christ. But our peace and our victory in Jesus do not depend on who our president is and what he or she believes. It also does not depend on the moral faithfulness of our nation and the ways that our tax dollars are used. Yes, it is wonderful to be able to be proud of our country and the decisions that we make and the people that we care for, but it is not a requirement for our joy or our salvation. Our faith and our convictions in Christ are not subject to majority rule. If radical shifts take place in the make up of our society, it is okay. It means God is up to something different from what we are used to. He is doing something new and will provide new ways for us to be victorious in Him.

To those of us who mourn I say this: Whoever becomes president will be the person God has chosen. As Paul teaches us: "there is no authority except that which God has established." While we may love and long for the days when many of our most influential government leaders were people who truly loved the Lord and sought out his truth, this is not a guarantee for us. A government that honors Christ is not necessary for the church to thrive. Right now the church is thriving in places where oppression reigns. The underground church in Iran and Iraq is exploding in the midst of life and death persecution. The rampant evil in those societies has opened the eyes of many to hear and believe the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Our country will return to Christ when the Church thrives and a movement of lives being changed is witnessed in our midst. Let's be initiators of that movement. No longer can we make the assumption that everyone we meet knows who Jesus is or has a basic understanding of His teachings. That day is long since past. Let's help welcome people everywhere into the presence of Jesus Christ so that we might experience a little more of the Kingdom of God on Earth as it is in Heaven. This is God's heart for the people of our country, and He will accomplish it by whatever means are necessary. Trust Him and you will never be disappointed.


