Living Face to Face

For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then we will see face to face.-1 Corinthians 13:12a

"One day we will see God face to face and all relationships will be perfected. In Christian community, our vision is to live face to face now - with God, with our brothers and sisters in Christ, and with the most vulnerable." - Messiah's Vision



On Sunday, October 21, 2012 Messiah participants came to church with small slips of paper in our hands - slips of paper that answered the question, "What is God calling Messiah to do over the next five years?" With the answer to this question in mind, people began to work in pairs, then fours, then groups of eight and then sixteen, sitting face to face, listening and discerning.

For the next few months, Messiah's Long Range Planning Team met to compile both the large group and individual responses to the question at hand, and the answer that has come is so simple, yet so compelling, "We are called to live face to face!"

We are called to live face to face with God:

(our desire for spiritual inreach)

We are called to come before our Lord face to face in confession, to kneel before the altar, and receive the bread and wine. We are called to times of silence and reverence and to places set aside for our spiritual care.

We are called to live face to face with our brothers and sisters in Christ:

(our desire for lasting connection):

We are called to community, connection and friendship, to small groups, and ministry teams. We are called to the kind of visible love and understanding that takes place, no matter what the situation, when we sit at the table face to face.

We are called to live face to face with the most vulnerable:

(our desire to care for those who need us most):

We are called to sit at the table with those in and outside our church whose hurts are not going away. We are called to bring ourselves face to face with the most vulnerable, including those we thought we'd never meet. We are called to love and to help.

"Messiah's Vision" is available in the Gathering Place. Please take a look, and please also plan to attend the special congregational dinner on Sunday, February 10 from 5 to 7pm. We are "Setting the Table" that night so that we might gather face to face - with God, with our brothers and sisters in Christ, and with the most vulnerable.

One said, "Thank you for your service and may God bless you all." Part of another letter said, "Shalom and grace be multiplied to you in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus..... I am writing to say thank you for your kind efforts and love for my kids. I remain you brother in Christ." A third letter said, "Saints, this is merely a sincere letter to tell you all thank you for the Christmas card and most definitely a big thank you for providing Christmas presents for my beautiful daughters through the Angel Tree Program."



Love INC (Love in the Name of Christ) Lake County Southwest will be starting their third year of serving people through a partnership with churches including Messiah. Some of the needs that they have filled are:

- A mother who lost her 6 year-old daughter in a drive-by shooting needed furniture, appliances, and lots of love and hope to get established in a new home.
- A senior citizen living alone in a very unhealthy situation needed help making his apartment livable, as well as encouragement to take control of his life.
- A young mother who made ends meet going door-to-door cleaning offices needed help finding a steady job with potential for training and growth.

In 2012 Love INC received more than 750 calls for help from people in southwest Lake County. They also delivered more than 500 beds, dressers, table and chair sets, and appliances to families with verified needs. To learn more about them, visit their website www.loveincsouthwest.org.

January 8, 2013 - Messiah Council Minutes

The Annual Meeting agenda was discussed. The Council and the Human Sexuality Forum Team will propose to vote at the Annual Meeting on the following:

> "In the spirit of "do no harm", leadership recommends that the 2005 and 2009 resolutions be retired and that a vote not be taken on the 2012 resolution."

Council would like to propose the use of both Welcoming Statements for different purposes. One is a more formal version; the second is a longer informal version.


Pastor Dawn presented the "Living Face to Face" document that Long Range Planning (LRP) has assembled from Messiah's Oct. 2012 All Congregation Visioning Event. There are three main categories: Living Face to Face with God (our desire for Spiritual In Reach), Living Face to Face with our Brothers and Sisters in Christ (our desire for Lasting Connection), and Living Face to Face with the Most Vulnerable (our desire to care for those who need us most).

We were short \$5,995 for the 2012 budget. We had an actual income of \$699,502. However, due to the finance committee and the fiscal responsibility of the ministries we ended the year positive due to limited spending. There were many end of year gifts. The proposed 2013 budget will increase to \$720,000,

College Student Spotlight - Emily Wortmann



Last year, the pajamas were donated to the Zacharias Center for sexually abused adults and children. The year before, pajamas were sent to the children in Japan after the devastating tsunami's. The Pajama Program is a nonprofit group that supplies new, warm pajamas and new books to needy children, many waiting and hoping to be adopted. They are youngsters who do not know the comforts of a mother or father to tuck them into bed and read them a bedtime story. Many have been abandoned or abused. Pajamas can be for a boy or girl, size infant to size 16. Collection boxes will be in the doorway vestibules until February 28.


MLPK (Messiah Lutheran Preschool and Kindergarten)



Lent Worship: The Meditations of All Our Hearts

For Lent this year, we are going to experience greater periods of silent prayer during worship. In ancient times, the season of Lent was a period of intense preparation by people who were preparing for baptism. They would fast, pray, and give alms, and the congregation would share those disciplines as a way of joining more closely in unity.

At Messiah we are seeking to have a heightened experience of God's presence by creating more times for silent prayer and reflection during our Lent worship services. First, there will be a brief silence for prayer between the introduction ("Let us pray") and the prayer of the day. We will pray individually, and the communal prayer will collect all our prayers together before God.

Second, we will keep silence for a period following the sermon. This will give all of us the chance to meditate on a word, phrase, or prayer petition that occurs to us, or simply to dwell in the silence of God for a moment before we begin the prayer of the day.

Third, the prayers of intercession will not have any spoken responses by the congregation. The minister will conclude each intercession with an invitation to "pray for the church," "pray for the world," and so on, and each of us will continue our prayer silently.

Lent was not originally meant to be a time of gloom and sorrow. It can be a time of joy, a time of special focus on the prayers of our hearts and on the voice of God to us, as we prepare for the glorious (and noisy!) feast of Easter.






