### Hallowed Ground

When I was growing up, my family was not frequently to be found in church. But we did go on pilgrimages to our country's great historic sites. I remember particularly visiting the battlefield at Gettysburg in 1988, when a huge gathering of Civil War re-enactors celebrated the 125th anniversary of that battle. Back then I knew the



battle formations of the two armies like the back of my hand. I also knew President Lincoln's Gettysburg address word for word, though the meaning mostly escaped me.



This month marks 150 years since those momentous three days of battle. And all year we are reaching the 50th anniversaries of major events in the Civil Rights movement, from Martin Luther King's "Letter from a Birmingham Jail"

and "I Have a Dream" speech to the violent attacks on the Birmingham marchers. Today I can't quite get through Lincoln's speech without some help, but I think

I have a better idea of what he was talking about.



I have heard people claim that America was founded as a uniquely Christian nation, and I think that's true, depending on what we mean by "Christian." For a variety of reasons, our country was shaped to a greater degree than most by the Bible, and especially by the Old Testament. And as I hope we've been learning this summer as we hear the stories of the Old Testament prophets, that part of the Bible isn't just about laws and God's judgment. It's about a God who is passionate in defense of marginal people, from widows and orphans to for-

eigners and people who are persecuted for their faith. When America has been most like a Christian nation, we have shared God's passion. I am filled with awe, even today, at the risks some people took and the dangers they faced in order to call our country to live up to that ideal, from the fields of Gettysburg to the streets of Birmingham. "We cannot hallow this ground," Lincoln said. Those who fought and died there have already done so.

My prayer this month as we mark our nation's birth and these other milestones of our life together is that we will treasure this hallowed ground-hallowed by the faith and lives of so many nameless people who worked to make it a place of freedom and opportunity for everyone. We stand always in need, as the prophets preached and as Lincoln said, of "a new birth of freedom."



### Council Highlights

#### June 4, 2013 - Messiah Council Minutes

Pam Roncal gave a Social Justice Ministry Report. This ministry is in a year-long discernment process that began in February. The Social Justice Ministry's mission is about looking at what is inequitable, especially for the most vulnerable.



Gerry Lemke shared the Treasurer's report. Expenses are generally in line with what was budgeted, but contributions are \$20,000 behind.

Candy Cooper shared the ELCA communications. The ELCA is supporting tornado relief in Oklahoma. Many new bishops were elected last month at the Synod Assembly, including the re-election of Bishop Wayne Miller.



Jason Miller shared the church administrator's report. The water pressure tanks have been repaired. The church mini-van needs \$1400 worth of work. Perhaps there are some people who, if asked, would be willing to help fix it.

Pastor Ben provided a written report. He celebrated First Holy Communion with the fifth graders in May. The spring series of sermon-based small groups concluded during the week of Pentecost. The pastors are looking ahead to the fall for a "face to face" theme based on our Scriptures. The adult forum wrapped up its series on Love Wins and is on hiatus for the summer. Pastor Ben also reported that the Metro Chicago Synod Assembly was both challenging and inspiring. Bishop Miller was re-elected with overwhelming support and they heard about exciting mission action taking place around the synod.

Randy Johnson shared that the septic tank was pumped from the parsonage. Also, the elevator was inspected and is working properly.

Mike Anderson, Gary Polk, and Pastor Ben shared the Synod Assembly report. The Metro-Chicago Synod is one of 65 synods in the United States, and consists of over 200 congregations. The synod asked that 5% of the church budget goes to undesignated synod benevolence. ELCA insurance will be changing next year. Different plans will be available and age will be taken into account.

Lisa Kelderhouse shared the preschool report. The hiring committee has posted for the Director and two other management positions and is now in the process of interviewing. Lynda Janezic is the interim director until a new director is hired. The preschool board is looking for and interviewing new members. Norma Scheck has retired after 18 years working at Before and After School Care.

Sue Kluk shared that our mission church Sagrado Corazon installed a new pastor after several years of waiting.

Next meeting will be Tuesday, July 30 at 7pm in the Luther Center.

### WE RAISED over \$1235 and collected 5,300 items!

Thank you for your offering for our PADS program and our sister church in Waukegan – Sagrado Corazon.

Thank you so much for participating in the mission project for the week of VBS. We collected over 5,300 items and were able to donate them to the Wauconda Food Pantry. The Junior High kids (LIGHTS) sorted and brought over every item on Friday of VBS week. The children helped put together Colossal Care Kits that will assist men and women who are homeless, poor, or otherwise don't have much. Each kit will contain personal care items to help a person feel clean and refreshed. These kits also will include a Bible verse, the name of our church and a non-perishable snack. We will give these kits out to our Pads guests when they come this fall for a safe night of rest and a warm meal.

Our VBS kids learned that God gives us Colossal-sized courage and will help us to face our fears. His plan includes giving to others in need. ALL of the VBS offering will go directly to our PADS (Providing Advocacy, Dignity, and Shelter) program here at Messiah and we will be supporting our sister church, Sagrado Corazon in Waukegan, with school supplies and new clothes for the fall.

Every day at Colossal Coaster World the children learned how to face their fears by Daring to Change, Daring to Speak Up, Daring to Believe, Daring to Stand Strong, and Daring to Trust. Ask the kids, they will know these phrases.

Our Bible verse was from Hebrews 13:6. "God helps me. I will not be afraid."

We had over 240 children and 75 volunteers. From teen helpers to grandparents, from help from home, registration, painting, decorating, setup, clean up, leading, singing and teaching – we can't thank you enough for making our VBS program another huge success.






### From The Council President

Thank you to those who attended one of the three Town Hall meetings on June 9. It is wonderful to have feedback from folks about our church: what's working well, what can be improved, etc. In particular, it was great spending the morning being "face to face" with members of my church family.



For those who couldn't make it on June 9, here are a few highlights:

We had an update on church finances. Income from all sources, as of May 31, was up slightly in 2013 from what it was last year at this time, but down slightly relative to the budget approved in January. So we have some ground to make up. Expenses are right on budget and will be watched closely.

The special giving drive in May, "Thankful for the Feast", garnered \$2,100; and the one-time appeal to help pay for needed repairs to leaking water tanks brought in an additional \$1,300. God bless you!

Kudos to those who utilize Messiah's "Simply Giving" program, which sets up recurring weekly or monthly donations. Click on the "Donate to Messiah" link on our website for more information.

Messiah's delegation to this year's Metropolitan Chicago Synod Assembly reported that our dear bishop, Bishop Wayne Miller, was re-elected for another six-year term. Bishop Miller's uplifting and annual report were the perfect reflection of an assembly that was "realistic and peaceful".

Pam Roncal did a wonderful job of explaining the mission of Messiah's new Social Justice Ministry. This group will help us examine and find ways to help alleviate systemic issues in our community, such as family abuse, access to senior services, education inequality, and other major societal ills.

There were healthy discussions on multiple topics, including our vision of "Living Face to Face" with God, with our brothers and sisters in Christ, and with the most vulnerable among us. Pastor Dawn announced that the fall preaching series will be on living face to face with those most vulnerable.

There will be another morning of Town Hall meetings on September 22, one after each Sunday service. A third Sunday of Town Halls will be held on January 12, 2014, which is two weeks prior to the Annual Meeting of the congregation, currently scheduled for January 26, 2014. I hope to see you at all these events!


