Starting Again

On Ash Wednesday, I preached about the importance of "starting again" for Christians, especially during this season of Lent. It was during Lent that new initiates to the faith experienced a period of especially intense preparation-being examined by the congregation, fasting, prayer--to conclude their years of study and ready themselves for their baptism at the Easter Vigil. But unlike many other ancient religions, this time of preparation



was not just for the new initiates. Veteran Christians joined with their new brothers and sisters in fasting, prayer, and almsgiving as the great Paschal Feast drew near. That's how the idea of fasting and other special devotions during Lent got started: it was a way for all the baptized people of God to experience starting again in their faith, just as those preparing for baptism were starting for the first time.


If you undertook some special disciplines for Lent, whether fasting, extra worship, daily prayer, or simply correcting a bad habit, you have by now likely experienced a setback or two. And that's ok! Lent is about renewing our faith, not about following a law. So in that spirit of renewal, I want to encourage everyone to "start again" this year when we, as God's baptized people, embark on Holy Week and enter into the heart of the mystery of our salvation.

On Palm Sunday, March 24, we enact together the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, and we hear how quickly the tide turns against Jesus and his peaceful, liberating movement. We are invited to remember that we are

m I}$ part of the crowd that cheers for Jesus and the crowd that calls for his crucifixion.



On Maundy Thursday, March 28, at 6pm we remember the meal Jesus shared--the last of so many shared with his disciples (not to mention Pharisees, friends, sinners, and tax collectors)--on the night of his betrayal. We will share in an ancient Christian practice

called the *agape* feast, and we will hear God's mighty actions in saving Israel from Egypt. The evening concludes with the celebration of Holy Communion and the stripping of the altar.



On Good Friday, March 29, at 12:30pm and 7:30 pm

the Holy Week liturgy continues with the Passion of Our Lord. Through words, im-


ages, and prayers we will contemplate the last hours of Jesus's life. We will lift our intercessions before God, and we




will be invited to revere the cross on which hung the salvation of the whole word.

On Holy Saturday, March 30, at 7:30 pm the liturgy concludes with the Easter Vigil. In this most solemn and spectacular event in the whole church year, we gather around a fire, process into the darkened, tomb-like sanctuary, hear the stories of new life from the Old Testament, renew our baptismal vows, and then celebrate the victorious rising of Our Lord with the first celebration of Holy Communion in the new Easter Season. This service

lasts almost two hours, but it ends with a festive reception to break the fast of Lent, with cake, strawberries, champagne, and other delicious things to celebrate the triumph of Jesus over death and hell. This year we are especially blessed to share this epic night with our sisters and brothers from Holy Apostles Episcopal Church here in Wauconda. Rev. Martha Gillette from Holy Apostles will preside at Holy Communion.



February 5, 2013 - Messiah Council Minutes

Jason Miller shared the church administrator's report. He found a discrepancy in the copier contract which means that Messiah will get a refund. He is looking into renegotiating the copier contract. The Wauconda Expo is Feb. 23 and 24 at the Wauconda High School. Jason is looking for people to man the Messiah booth.

Pastor Ben reported that for the next two months the Adult Forums will be considering Heaven and Hell; who gets saved, from what, and how; and the question of angels and demons. He shared that Megan Randazzo is leading the follow-up ministry, and that this spring may be our largest new member class since 2011.

Pastor Dawn shared Messiah's vision of "Living Face to Face" She reported that ministry directors will be filling out a "Living Face to Face" vision worksheet and presenting to council during upcoming meetings.

Dave Kimes shared Council Member expectations, living in community, Messiah's core values, appointed liaisons, and set up the 2013 schedule.

Council appointed Gerry Lemke as Treasurer.

The congregational meeting was discussed. Council members and pastors shared their enthusiasm over the positive outcome of the meeting. Congregational meeting minutes were passed out and will be approved at the March council meeting.

Mike Anderson gave the Building and Construction report. Ceiling touch-ups in the Gathering Place are completed. Kids Club is remodeling the basement. They are removing the material from the walls and replacing with drywall and moving wall partitions from the preschool to the basement. They may be redoing the floors as well, but a flooring material has not yet been chosen or approved.




Next council meeting will be on Tuesday, March 5 at 7pm in the Luther Center.



Children's Ministry



We have been busy studying some stories from the New Testament. We just started our 5th rotation for the school year. All together we will read and study over 17 lessons from the Bible. 


