Church Council Reports

July 25, 2016

BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

- 1. Reminder The week of 8-12 August there will be a contractor working in the upper and lower floors of the Education Wing (older section) to replace 52 windows. Schools schedules are not affected and disruptions to individual classrooms will be very minimal but could possibly require small groups to shift to a different room.
- 2. We are still pursuing bids to replace the shingles on the Education roof
- 3. The BoT contracted a professional building inspection firm and they have just submitted their report which the Trustees are reviewing.
- 4. The new offices for the Pastors are largely completed. The senior pastor's office (formerly) will now serve as a conference room.

FINANCE COMMITTEE'S REPORT:

As of the end of June, we had \$351,461 in our fund balance.

There was \$21,508 more in expenses than income for the month of June. As of June 30, 2016 there has been \$7,967 more in income than expenses for the year. There were exceptional expenses for our cleaning service and the building inspection that drove up the deficit for the month.

We have spent 49.7% of our budget of our \$1.62m and have taken in 49.73% of the projected contribution income for the year.

WELCOMING COMMITTEE's REPORT:

• The Welcoming Committee continues to make a push for growing the ranks of greeters and welcome booth supporters for our Sunday services. We have been really pleased with so many people pitching in to help make Messiah an even more welcoming community. We are hoping to utilize small groups, children and youth to help out with the welcoming duties in the future. Weather permitting we'll be utilizing the front tented area outside of the main doors for welcoming and fellowship time. When we had that set up earlier in the summer, there were many "thumbs up" comments shared with the welcoming team. People seemed to like being able to mingle outside as they come and go Messiah.

WORSHIP COMMITTEE's REPORT;

The Worship Committee met on July 12.

- The Committee continued ongoing planning through December, with some discussion about plans for Christmas Eve (Saturday) and one service on Christmas Day (Sunday).
- Received news that Sharon Lesley, long-time chair of the Altar Guild, will be replaced by Kay Green and Holly Kaniewski; Sharon and her husband are relocating as of 1 September.
- Further discussion of replacing/restocking UMC Hymnals; we learned a new UMC Hymnal is in the works that will incorporate some new hymns with some older.
 - Don't know how soon that will be available or whether it will require Messiah Church to have a license to download desired hymns from the Internet and projected onto screens.
 - o In the meantime, we will investigate possibility of replacing or restocking hymnals from supplies made available by UMC churches that have recently closed their doors.
- Discussed possibility of supplementing or replacing donuts between services with healthier fare; no decision made--further discussion needed.
- Discussed recruiting lay members for a team that would create and prepare worship experiences such we had on Good Friday. Next date targeted for such a service would be during Advent.





Bldg Cmte Funds Remaining & Way Ahead

- The Finance Director reports \$9,991.93 unobligated funds in the Replacement Reserve account, retained for Bldg Cmte use dating back to the original Council authorization of \$75,000 for 3 Tasks
- We are withholding \$8,000 for a lump sum payment to the general contractor, Whitener-Jackson, in the event the church either
 - Elects not to pursue modernization and repairs
 - Elects a different general contractor in pursuit of modernization and repairs

In the event the Project does not proceed, through no fault of Whitener & Jackson, Inc. or, if the Owner elects to proceed with a different contractor, the Owner agrees to pay Whitener & Jackson, Inc. eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) for Pre-Construction Services. The Owner would have no further obligations to Whitener & Jackson, Inc. whatsoever.

- Following tonight's discussion, the Bldg Cmte intends to engage KGA in a discussion on revising the Phase One concept depiction
 - We will request a firm fixed price bid under the existing contract and, if it is less than \$1,990, we intend to authorize a new Phase One concept depiction
 - If the bid is greater than \$1,990, we will come back to the Council and request additional funds
