Students entering 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grade have required reading assignments that will be explained the first week of school. Students entering 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> will be required to write a book report while 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students will be required to complete a journal with 8-10 entries.

Check the reading criteria under each grade level, assignments will be due the first few weeks of school. Please help us by making a special trip to the library several times this summer to see that your child is able to accomplish his or her required reading.
