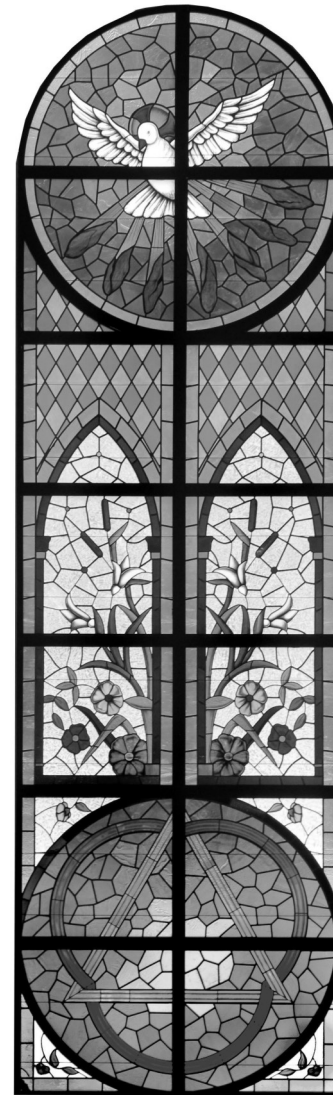

Rev. Jacqueline Slaughter-Bio

Born the oldest of the four children in her family, Jackie is a native of Mississippi and still rings her cowbell from Mississippi State where she earned her undergraduate degree. Although she confesses that God's call on her life has been there since she was a little girl making mud pies in her grandmother's back yard; Jackie is what we call a second career pastor having previously worked as a case manager, group home supervisor, and trauma counselor with rape and incest survivors. Having asserted at an early age that "people can do some strange things and one day I will find out why", Jackie found her work in Psychology and counseling to be a comfortable home, but, God had other plans for her. God had always spoken to Jackie through the voice of others: first through a great aunt who told her that she would one day marry a preacher and then through many others who were always quick to tell Jackie they saw God's hand on her and that she would one day preach. Finally, after what she describes as her epiphany of hearing "the one voice she had demanded to hear", Jackie accepted her call to ordained ministry.

She is a graduate of Methodist Theological School in Ohio where she earned her Master of Divinity and Master of Theology degrees. She has pastored churches not only in our own conference, but in the West Ohio Conference and the British Methodist Church as well. Ordained in 2006 during the 50th anniversary year of full clergy rights for women, Jackie was the 2nd African-American female ordained in the history of the Alabama-West Florida Conference. Currently, she joyfully serves alongside the church family of Metropolitan UMC.
