

# **CORE VALUE: CONNECT**

In Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus gave His followers some final instructions before He returned to the Father. He told them to go into all the nations, make disciples, baptize them, and teach them to follow all He had commanded.

Last year our church adopted the core values of "Care, Connect, Call and Courage". This year, we are challenging our church family to live out our core value of **CONNECT**.

Connection is a deep and meaningful part of our lives. God models this for us in the trinity as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are always connected to each other in community and unity. Genesis 1:27 tells us we have been made in God's image— we have been made to **CONNECT!** 

Our core value is focused on "connecting people to people with the goal of connecting them to God". It's normal to keep and cultivate relationships, but we are called to do more than simply connect with others. We have been called to help people connect with God!


