FINDING NEW LIFE

There's a crisp chill in the air as a group of students make their way from a classroom on a fall afternoon. They head just a short distance away to a coffee shop—their small, little oasis nestled in the middle of campus. Just inside the doors, they find warmth that flows over their body and spirit. At one of the tables, a residence hall RA is chatting away with some residents discussing how they can build community among their floor. At another table, a professor is looking over some notes before teaching his evening class. The group of students find a corner booth to settle into, order their coffee, cappuccinos and hot chocolates, and start studying for an upcoming Bio-Chemistry test.

For some, like BSU Director Jerry Carmichael, this type of ministry has only been a dream. But through the generosity of some Columbia locals, this dream is quickly becoming a reality.

When The Coffee Ground, a local Columbia coffee shop closed its doors last October, owner Jenn Myles did not want that to be the end of their three-year venture.

"My husband and I are also interested in ministry and how our leftover coffee equipment could be used, that we could somehow use this to glorify God," Myles said.

After Mizzou's Christian Campus House turned down the opportunity to open their own coffee shop, CCH and one of Myles' former employees looked to the BSU. Seeing this as an chance to both generate funds for the ministry and to create a space for meaningful relationships to develop, the BSU Board of Directors and staff agreed in June 2009 that this opportunity could be profitable in more than one way.

Situated in the heart of Mizzou's 1,372-acre campus, BSU Ministry for Tomorrow's Leaders currently owns the only remaining public property still present on the University campus. 

IN MEMORY | WILLIAM "BILL" MARSHALL

Mizzou BSU would like to take a special moment to remember our dear friend, board member, and partner in ministry. William ("Bill") Marshall passed away on Friday, July 30, 2010 at the age of 76.

Bill was born November 11, 1933 in Halltown, Missouri to Elmer and Zelda Royston Marshall and they preceded him in death. He was married in 1967 to Bonnie Gerhardt.

William served for three years in the U.S. Air Force while stationed in Florida. He was a 1955 graduate of the University of Missouri where he received a BS in Mechanical Engineering. He later received three Masters Degrees from Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Kansas City. He was very involved in Campus Ministry while serving in the Kansas City area and the states of Kansas and Missouri. Bill began work as a Civil Engineer in 1975 and started Marshall Engineering in Columbia in 1983.

He was a member of Cornerstone Baptist Church, served as President of Little Bonne Femme Baptist Association and was very active in ministries for the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship.

Bill was very proud of his Irish heritage and growing up on the farm in the Ozarks. He loved baseball, the Missouri Tigers and enjoyed learning about Native American culture and collecting Pueblo pottery.

He is survived by his wife of 43 years, Bonnie of Columbia; son, Brian Wm. Marshall and wife, Melissa of Jefferson City; brother, Robert T. Marshall and wife, Shirley of Columbia; sister, Kathy Layman of Marshfield, Missouri; grandchildren, Boaz, Cyrus, Gabriel and Sarah Jane; brother-in-law, Dr. Donald Gerhardt and wife, Debbie of Columbia and many other loving family members.

He was also preceded in death by sister, Marlene Curn.

Services were held Saturday, August 7, 2010 at Memorial Baptist Church in Columbia. Burial followed in Walnut Grove Cemetery in Boonville, Missouri.



