



WORSHIP RESPONSE AT MOSAIC

Mosaic has always created safe environments for people to come and investigate a relationship with God through his Son and to inspire followers of Jesus to mature in their spiritual journey and live the life God has called them to.

The purpose behind our Response Time in our services is to give people different opportunities to respond to God in worship. We encourage people to respond in any of the following ways

PRAYER

James 5:13-14 reads, "Is any one of you in trouble? He should pray... Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord."

You are welcomed to stay in your seat during worship or you can go and receive prayer from our Ministry team. If you need prayer for healing and need counsel we encourage you to take advantage of our ministry team.

COMMUNION

1 Corinthians 11:23-26 tells us that ...The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, ²⁴and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

We take communion through "intinction." That's an awfully big word, which simply means that we "dip" the bread into juice provided at the worship stations. They are "self-serve" communion stations to allow you, your family or your small group to take communion together. We ask that you let scripture guide you and please take communion only if you have made a decision to receive Christ in your life. We also ask that you take communion with a clear heart, first confessing your sin to God and making any sin right with others in the body of Christ.

THE CROSS

Colossians 2:13-14 states, "You were dead because of your sins and because your sinful nature was not yet cut away. Then God made you alive with Christ, for he forgave all our sins. He canceled the record of the charges against us and took it away by nailing it to the cross".

Jesus paid the ultimate price for our sin on the cross. We encourage you to take opportunity to symbolically nail your concerns to the cross with the supplies that are provided. It is a powerful response to God's love.

CANDLES

Candles have symbolized the presence of God since the times of the Old Testament. The Israelites kept a flame burning in the tabernacle, and first century church kept a flame burning at Jesus's empty tomb. Sometimes candles were used to remember those who were been persecuted. Some churches light candles to remember the dead. At Mosaic we light candles to remember and pray for the living - the people in our lives who need God's presence.
