<u>September 13 & 14:</u> lowa Tests of Educational Development Test–ITED is given annually to all high school students. They are tested in various areas especially based on problems solving and critical analysis of texts. Besides letting students and parents know current achievement, an important purpose is to provide data for the teachers so they better plan lessons to meet the needs of the students.

<u>September 13 & 14:</u> Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT)-This aptitude test is used to estimate the students' natural areas of ability. This test also assist teachers as they plan lessons.

<u>October 19:</u> Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT) This is a preliminary version of SAT, given to the junior students. It helps students prepare for SAT or ACT. High PSAT score qualifies for National Merit Scholarship.

PLAN Test-PLAN is a pre ACT Test given to sophomore students.
