Questions

I was recently at a workshop on preaching (yeah, I still have a TON to learn!) and I learned a new way to engage a Bible text to get my heart and mind and spirit ready to write a sermon. So often we pastors think that we have to come up with the right answer, the right interpretation of a text. Like we've got to get it right or we're not being good and faithful preachers. And my guess is that's not too far off from what people who don't preach for a living feel like when they read the Bible too. That we feel like we've got to get the answers about the text; and, probably, that we would need an expert (like a pastor or a Bible scholar) to get those right answers. Well this way of engaging the text has nothing to do with answers and everything to do with questions.

Here's what you do:

1. Read the Bible text.
2. Ask every question you can think of about the text. No question is off limits.
3. Don't answer any questions.

You'd be amazed at how much the questions dive into the heart of the text. You'd be amazed at how much we know in NOT KNOWING! You'd be amazed at the open possibilities of the Bible and of God.

So next time you think about reading the Bible, give this a try. Try it by yourself, with your family, with a friend. You don't have to have any answers—only questions! And in those questions, in their mystery and depth, the wondrous, wondering power of the Holy Spirit God will draw you close.

Cub Foods Bagging Fundraiser

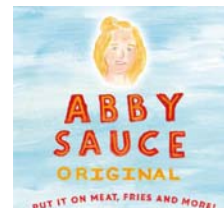

Sunday, November 6th we will celebrate All Saints Sunday at Mount Calvary. On this day we remember the members from Mount Calvary who have died this past year, by lighting a special candle for them. Others in the congregation will then be invited to come forward and light a votive candle in remembrance of loved ones that died this past year. In our hearts and prayers we will remember all the saints who have gone before us.

Pipe Organ Fact Gathering A Liberal Arts Education

Mount Calvary's pipe organ exploratory group has continued meeting with manufacturing representatives and trying out local samples of their works. It has been a fascinating and educational experience. I'm struggling to come up with another venture that would be similarly rooted in principles of physics, history, art, architecture, business, acoustics, carpentry, religion, foreign languages, and of course, music. Fortunately, our group possesses good "pooled knowledge" and we feel we can meet the challenge.



A recent highlight was a trip to St. Peter, MN to tour the manufacturing facilities of Hendrickson Organ Company. After a shop tour, we were treated to demonstrations of pipes of various materials and construction techniques that make up the different ranks, such as reeds, flutes, etc., giving the organ its varied timbres. There is certainly an awful lot of mechanical technology that goes into pushing air through tubes precisely on demand! After our workshop tour, we sampled some Hendrickson organs, large and small, old and new, in three St. Peter churches.

While pipe organs have been around for about a millennium and a sense of acceptable convention has been reached, there are no standards or sense of what is truly "best" for all purposes. Some organs are called "trackers," which indicate a completely mechanical connection (levers) between the keys and the release of air into the pipe. Our current Rieger organ is a tracker. There are also electro-pneumatic or electrically controlled organs, which use electronic switches controlled by the keys. This type of organ has the advantage of a movable console which also allows for separation of the console from the pipes, as it is connected by electrical cable rather than a system of levers.

Another distinction is in voicing--for support of congregational and choral singing versus for organ performance. Our identified need is to enhance our worship experience through greater support of congregational singing. This is the quest of most congregations that install pipe organs.

The bottom line is that the best pipe organ for Mount Calvary would be one uniquely designed for our sanctuary. It would have visual appeal that works with the existing architecture and fixtures. It would offer flexibility in the positioning of the console. It would not overpower, but would be able to fill our worship space with glorious sound. Finally, it would fit our mission, our interest, and yes, our financial resources.

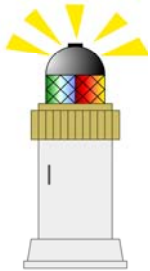

Capital Appeal Update

Capital Appeal Update

We began our third 3-year capital appeal, *"50 Years of Worship & Service"* on January 1, 2010. As of September 30, 2011 we have collected \$202,698 of the pledged amount of \$311,000 or 65% of goal.

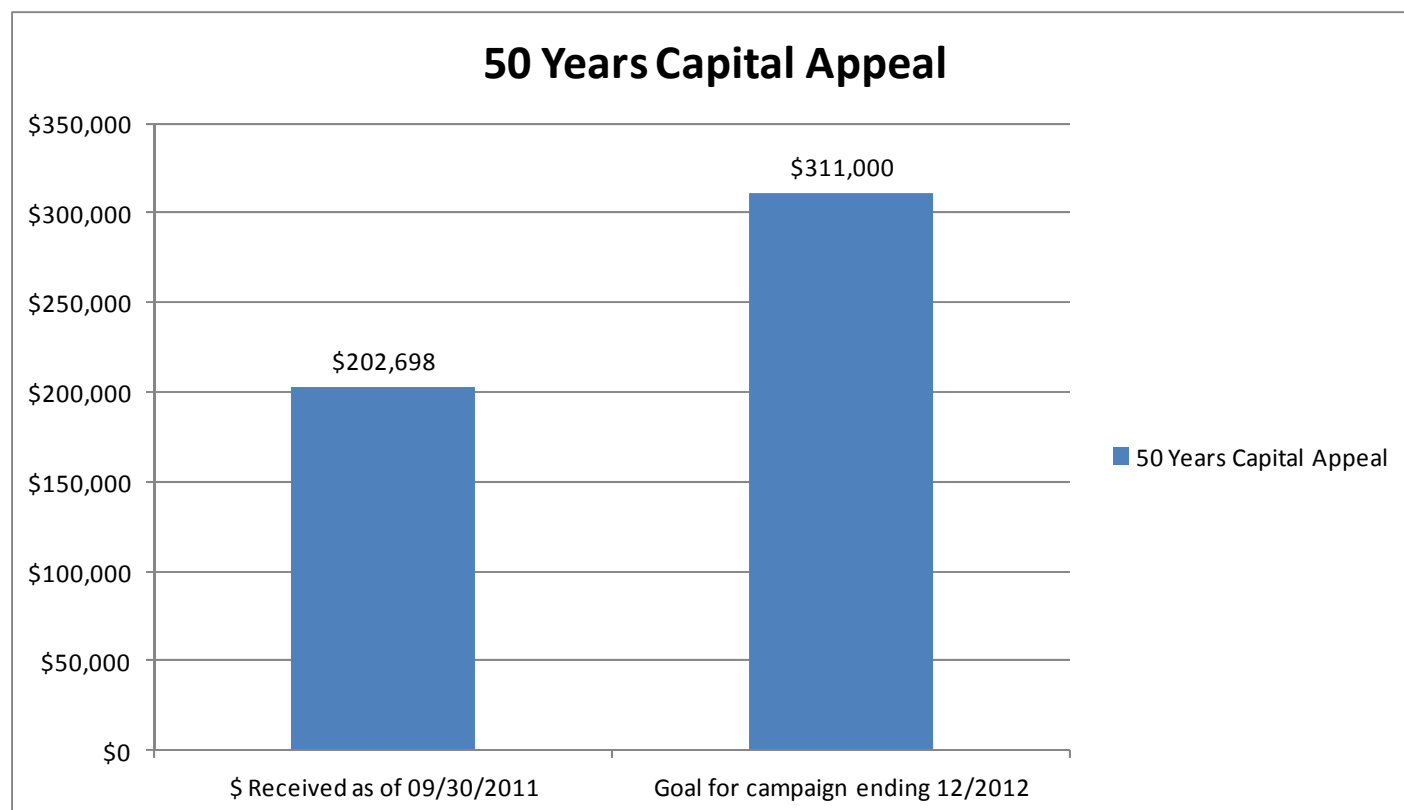
The money collected through this appeal is distributed as follows:

- 10% of the received amount goes to the Eagan Resource Center and African Ministries; each receiving 5%
- \$9,627 for our second mortgage monthly payment
- Any remaining dollars at the end of each month goes towards the capital improvement fund

As of 9/30/2011 (21 months), we have collected the following amounts:

- Eagan Resource Center - \$10,132
- African Ministries - \$10,132
- **Second mortgage - \$182,431 collected and \$202,162 paid out = (\$19,731)
- Capital improvements - \$0
