### A.mpact requires Power –

- 1. Greek word for **Power** δύναμις (dynamis)
- means "power," "mighty works"
- acts of power ("miracles") or Virute

**Dynamis**, is the word from which **dynamite** is derived.

  - **Define Authority** 
    - Gk. ἐξουσία (exousia) Exousia denotes an authority manifested in power.
    - It's also delegated power which means the right to exercise power

- RECAP
  Gifts without Love (1 Cor 12-13)
- 1. Gifts without love seems to take on a form of carnality (Fleshiness)
- 2. Without love motivating their operation, all the spiritual gifts are valueless, worthless, pointless (vv. 1–3).
  - a. We accomplish nothing
  - b. We are nothing
  - c. We gain nothing
- Without love, we fail to glorify God. (Eph 3:16-20)

# Gifts from the Son - Ministry Gifts (Eph. 4:11-13)

Also known as Office gifts; office gifts are actually gifts (Gr. domata) to the church by its Founder, Jesus Christ Himself. These "gifts of the Son" are placed in the church "to equip the saints for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ"

# Gifts from the Father - Motivational Gifts (Rom 12:6-8)

These gifts come from God the Father when we are born into the Kingdom of God. These gifts are described in Romans 12:3–8 and seem to be foundational to our emotional make-ups and personalities. They reveal how we are "motivated" in the Kingdom and tend to operate in this new life. These gifts are grafted into our spiritual DNA.

Gifts from the Holy Spirit - Manifestation Gifts (1 Cor. 12:4-11)

 These gifts are the supernatural manifestations of the Holy Spirit working through a believer. They are given to the Church to benefit both believers and unbelievers. These gifts represent the work God does through the life of a believer in a given situation to demonstrate His supernatural power.

Gifts from the Holy Spirit - Manifestation Gifts

Three groupings of charismatic gifts:

Discerning gifts —

gifts of revelation (the power to know)

**Dynamic gift**s —

gifts of power (the power to do)

Declarative gifts—

gifts of inspired utterance (the power to speak)

- Words of Knowledge

- **Dynamic gifts** provide extraordinary powers to effect changes in the lives and circumstances of both saints and sinners.

- Disciples went out Anointed w/ oil by 2's Healing Mark 6:12
- Operation of Miracles

- Declarative gifts
- Through **declarative gifts** the Holy Spirit prompts men to speak forth publicly to minister "edification and exhortation and comfort" to the church and one another.
