Matthew 5:27-30

GOALS:

1. To grow in relationship with God.
2. To grow in relationship with others.
3. To grow our groups and start new groups.

FACILITATOR: The questions that follow are designed to stir reflection and discussion on last week's message. - Having read the passage, which of the 3 routes to *moral corruption* is the most pervasive in our society (refer to part 1 of outline on back)? And, which one do you relate with the most?
- In verses 29-30, is Jesus suggesting self-mutilation?
- What are the principles that He is teaching regarding *cause and effect* in verses 29-30?
- What is OUR responsibility in the prevention of *stumbling*?
- How can we help each other with these principles?
