In His Steps

When God is Not in Control: Marriage

Matthew 5:31-32

GOALS:

1. To grow in relationship with God.
2. To grow in relationship with others.
3. To grow our groups and start new groups.

FACILITATOR: The questions that follow are designed to stir reflection and discussion on last week's message. Please read through them prior to your meeting, so you can be prepared to prayerfully pace your group well. And remember, a facilitator's goal is to promote increased biblical awareness, as well as individual self-awareness— a combination that with the help of the Holy Spirit, results in revelation and transformation.

REVIEW: What is the current series? Why are we doing this? What is this week's title? Why is this subject important to study?

- Who here doesn't have ANY divorce in their family? Who here has more than one instance of divorce in their family? And, how has that shaped your view of marriage?

BIBLE STUDY AND APPLICATION:

Read Matthew 5:31-32, Deuteronomy 24:1 (HCSB from outline)

- Having read the passage, what's the biblical ideal for marriage? Why do you think God would place such importance on *unbroken* marriage?
- Which of the Ten Commandments is this subject directly related to?

Read Matthew 19:1-12 (HSCB from outline)

- What does the current cultural view say about the *role* of God in marriage? Can you separate what Jesus says about *marriage, divorce, and adultery*, with what He says about *sin and eternity*?

Read 1 Corinthians 7:1-15

- What is Paul's word of grace to those who find themselves in spiritually mismatched marriages?
