Praying With a Broken Heart Nehemiah 1-2

GOALS:

- 1. To grow in relationship with God.
- 2. To grow in relationship with others.
- 3. To grow our groups and start new groups.

FACILITATOR: The questions that follow are designed to stir reflection and discussion on last week's message. Please read through them prior to your meeting, so you can be prepared to prayerfully pace your group well. And remember, a facilitator's goal is to promote increased biblical awareness, as well as individual self-awareness— a combination that with the help of the Holy Spirit, results in revelation and transformation.

ICE BREAKER: Have you ever faced an issue/dilemma in which only prayer, followed by action, would solve?

REVIEW: What is the current series? Why are we doing this? What is this week's title? Why is this subject important to study?

BIBLE STUDY AND APPLICATION:

Read Nehemiah 1:1-11

- After reading the passage, what was the report concerning the city of Jerusalem that was given to Nehemiah? What was his reaction to this news?
- Is it right for us to feel compassion for those that are hurting, and yet do nothing for them? How should we help those that are struggling, whether it is spiritually, physically, emotionally, etc.?

Read Nehemiah 2:1-8

- After reading these verses, do you think Nehemiah's prayer was answered? Why or why not? Have you ever had a prayer answered in a similar way? Share with the group.
- Do you think Nehemiah had formulated a plan in advance of speaking with the king? What or who do you think gave him the courage to ask for so much?

Read Nehemiah 2:11-18

- After Nehemiah inspects the condition of the wall around the city, how does he involve others in his plan to rebuild the wall?
- What is MOST important in verse 18, as he stirs the others to get to work?
- What lessons can we learn from Nehemiah's example?
