### **Seeking Storage**




Our Good Neighbor Team has both a blessing and a request to share with the church family.

The 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation falls on October 31 this year.

The Reformation, which is the beginning of the Protestant Church, began with Martin Luther's public iteration of spiritual principles and continued with a number of visionary Christian thinkers throughout the 16th century (including John Calvin and John Knox, the fathers of the Presbyterian denomination).

Here at North Creek we will be marking this world-changing event with Reformation Sunday on October 29, and educational opportunities to learn about the principles and theology that formed the foundations of the Protestant church every Sunday through November 12.

Here are a few things North Creek is doing to mark this pivotal event in church history:



#### Reformation 500:



#### **Mothers of Preschoolers: Free Indeed**

Another year of MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers) has begun at NCPC! Our group consists of almost 40 women ready to dive deeper into our theme, Free Indeed. Our MOPS group has a history of giving back to our community. Each year we choose 1-2 activities or organizations to support such as Cocoon House, Mary's Place, Helping Hands and Project Linus. This year, we set a goal to reach out to NCPC specifically in an effort to both inform the church of who we are and to thank the church for allowing us to use space in the building for our meetings and childcare for the last 14+ years.



#### What is MOPS?

MOPS is a group of moms with children ranging in age from newborn to kindergarten. We come together to encourage one another through the journey of motherhood, share life's ups and downs, and walk with each other as we grow deeper in relationship with Jesus. NCPC MOPS meetings are held in the Fireside Room while our young children are cared for in the nursery and neighboring classrooms. We enjoy a meal together before diving into a devotion given by a different member of our leadership team each week. The majority of our time spent in meetings is focused on either a speaker, crafting, small group fellowship, or outreach projects.

### **Fundraising**

One of our fundraising efforts this year is a pancake breakfast, which is taking place in the Fellowship Hall Sunday, October 15 before each service. We are asking for a suggested donation of \$5 per person before enjoying a delicious breakfast of pancakes, fruit, ham, coffee, and juice. In addition to breakfast, a raffle will be taking place for all who wish to purchase \$1 raffle tickets.
