#### **Power of Prayer**

Do you believe in the power of prayer? I Do!

Prayer is the one and only thing that has changed my life. I will call it my "Personal Spiritual Renewal" and it is something I pray will happen to us all. It is true, loving God with all we

have and loving neighbor as we love ourselves is our greatest commandment, however, it might feel difficult to find our starting place in this renewed, and transformed life. Prayer is usually the best place to begin for a personal spiritual renewal.

Prayer is the way we will become, and remain, connected to Christ. Jesus reminds us about the importance of being connected in his image of the vine and the branches. "Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me." ~John 15:4. Many people have misinterpreted this into something like, "Keep believing and keep working," but that is not the message at all. Jesus says, "Stay connected to me as I have stayed connected to God." The vine and the branch image reminds us that "fruit" is what God produces, because we only bear it on God's behalf.

Living the Christian life and being productive for God are not things we do. It is what the Spirit does in us as we first and foremost keep our lives connected. How? Prayer! Prayer opens the windows of the soul. Prayer acknowledges that God alone is able! Prayer is not what we do when we have already done all that we could. Prayer is living constantly in the awareness that it is "not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, says the Lord of Hosts." ~Zechariah 4:6. Prayer is what links us to God's active presence. There cannot be any personal or even corporate spiritual renewal without prayer.

I would like to invite you to the first annual "Pray-Each-Day-In-May" May.

I do not know if I am in love with the name, but the concept is solid. Maybe more like, "Pray-Each-Day-In-May-a-thon."

Regardless of the name. I invite you on a 31 day journey into your own Personal Spiritual Renewal. There is power in prayer, but how do we pray? Let us look at what Jesus had to say about the subject of prayer. I have included my own perspective of what Christ's instructions for prayer might look like in our daily lives.

#### **Instructions on Prayer Luke 11:1-4**

Now Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he stopped, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples." So he said to them, "When you pray, say:

Father, may your name be honored: God is, and so we pray. Creator God, we acknowledge that God, you are! God, you are King in our lives. God,

you are sovereign. God, you are in control. God, you are at work in my life.

May your kingdom come: God we ask that you make us new. Create in us clean hearts. Make us your servants in your kingdom here on earth. Make us disciples for your glory so that others might ready themselves to know you.

Give us each day our daily bread: God we know that there is nothing on this earth more life giving, more life saving, more life changing, more life sustaining than a full and complete relationship with you. Everything which we need for a bountiful life comes from you. We trust in what you provide and we will be satisfied with all that comes from you.

Forgive us our sins: We are not without flaws and, thankfully, flawlessness is not what you require in order to seek righteousness. You desire us. Here I am. Broken in my relationship with others and my relationship with you. Forgive me, O God, and help me to forgive myself as well.

We also forgive everyone who sins against us: God you have poured out your love, your grace, your mercy, and your forgiveness on me, time and time again. Pour it out over me again until love, grace, mercy, and forgiveness pour out from my life into the lives of those who are my friends and even the lives of those people I have not yet learned to call friend. For, though I have been wronged, and even hurt, by the actions of others, I have not lost anything because I am complete in you.

And do not lead us into temptation: God, this world is a mixed up place and there has never been a more important time for your presence to be felt on earth than now. Give us strength to keep on a path which leads to righteousness, a right relationship with you, with ourselves with our neighbors, and with all of creation. Keep our focus, God, on you. Especially when the distractions of the world become great, remind us that you are greater. For it is your Kingdom which we seek here, now, and for all eternity. You have the only power we require. May our lives continue to point to your glory, today, and all days. Amen.

You might choose to use this as your daily prayer. You might want to create your own. You might decide to spend each day in meditation about how the Spirit would have you pray, at this moment. You might have music playing or coffee brewing.

Whatever you choose to do, just do something. It is an invitation.

Let us be the "Children of the God" of *1* Thessalonians 5:16-18... "Rejoicing always, praying without ceasing, giving thanks in all circumstances" because God is. Let this message and your lives continue to be God's good news.

#### **Around The Grounds and Within**



Children's Time is provided during worship for elementary school age children, after which childcare is available for all ages.




## **Box Tops for Education!**
