Bobby & Becky were high school sweethearts and married in 1974. Not long after, Bobby was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 3rd round in June of 1978. He was named All American 1978 Shortstop and became a born again Christian in October of the same year. He played professional baseball for 7 years with parts of 4 years at Major League Level. An infielder that had Cal Ripken, Jr. in awe of his natural ability, Bobby Bonner was the future of the Baltimore Orioles at shortstop. After winning a World Series with the Orioles in 1983, he left the United States to pursue missionary work with his family in Zambia.

Bobby and Becky Bonner have been missionaries to Zambia, Africa since 1988. Bobby started the North Star Bible Institute of Zambia and a Pastor Training Course (PTC) to train nationals to reach their people with the gospel.

Bobby and Becky believe strongly in the great commission, evangelism, church planting, and discipleship. Thus, the establishment of IAM Ministries (International African Missions). The philosophy of IAM Ministries is to train nationals to train nationals, to reach nationals. They have been doing this for 23 years in Zambia and now have men trained doing the same thing in Angola, Congo, Tanzania, Malawi, and Botswana. Over 250 nationals have been trained resulting in the establishment of over 200 churches planted, 4 Bible Institutes established in Zambia, a deaf ministry, prison and police ministry, blind and handicap ministry, and an Encounter Revival ministry.
