Greetings!

As Girls in Action gets ready to celebrate a 100th birthday, I want to reflect on some ways that GA, which by the way when I came along, was Girls Auxiliary, affected my view of ministry. My first solo in church came at age 5 as a Sunbeam (now Mission Friends). I still remember the song, and even what my Mother (sitting proudly on the front row) was wearing. Apparently for me, it was big.



And then came GAs, where we made flags of "mission countries", prepared food from each nation, wrote letters to missionaries, memorized verses and even chapters of scripture, and did projects for community service. We passed "steps" each year, and those who did enough work according to the guidelines got to "walk" as we called it in a GA coronation at the end of each year. This pageant was a regal event, processing down the church aisle, complete with long white dress, attendants, and great ceremony. We would each tell of something we had learned. (See picture. Ok, you can laugh! My Mom didn't get this tomboy to dress up willingly).

Although many of the "customs" of GA have changed to fit the times, the message hasn't changed. The pledge, motto, and method of teaching may use different wording today, but the goal in both — learning and doing missions — is the same. Girls in Action of today still come together with just as many goals for service and ministry as they had in the beginning. Happy 100th Birthday, GA!

The way we do ministry that works may have changed through the years, but one constant is this: The church is the place where parents can get help as they lead their child toward a relationship with Jesus Christ — to love and serve Him. But we believe that what happens at home is just as important. Why? Because a child learns to place importance on whatever his/her parents deem as important. My mother, as GA leader in our church, taught me that service is important. At home, she lived it by making and taking food to those in need. My Dad, a deacon, made sure that we had family devotions, along with being at church on Sundays. What happened at home matched what happened at church. Therefore, for me, it became important. Children still learn what is important by watching their parents live each day.

Here at OVBC, we are ready to work alongside you, parents, as you teach your children to walk with Christ! So each week that we see him/her, we want to reinforce what you are teaching. The clock is ticking toward the day when each will go out into the world — simply equipped with the truths that we, together, have taught them are important. Let's make each day count!
