

CY and Pat Kim with Christ Reaching Asia Mission (CRAM):

The Kims serve in China and North Korea.

C.Y. and Patricia Kim serve as Field Directors for Christ Reaching Asia Mission (CRAM). CRAM's mission is to help the poor, feed the hungry, heal the sick and provide education. They serve in countries that others may shy away from: China and North Korea.



In China, the Kims minister through the Hunchen Special Education School, the Good News Bakery, the Hope Farm, the Burning Heart Ranch with Hippotherapy Program, and the Hope Foreign Language School.

- The Hunchen Special Education School nurtures and trains disabled children. It also
- provides vocational training through the Good News Bakery as well as other means.
- The bakery provides 7,500 sweet red bean bread rolls each month to feed the children of the school as well as others.
- The Hope Farm also provides food for the school.
- The Burning Heart Ranch houses the Hippotherapy Program, which uses horses to provide therapy for individuals with physical, emotional and learning disabilities.
- The Hope Foreign Language School teaches English to the people of the community as well as providing computer and other educational opportunities.

North Korea's projects include the Canaan Kindergarten, Canaan Daycare Center, Canaan Medical Clinic, Morning Star Children's Home, Good News Farm, Sonbong Bread Company and the Sonbong Soymilk Company.

- The Canaan Kindergarten and Daycare Center provide training and childcare for approximately 40 children.
- The Canaan Medical Clinic, in partnership with another clinic, provides care to meet the medical needs of 2000 residents in the surrounding area. Displaced children find a home at the Morning Star Children's Home, which can accommodate up to 100 children.
- The Good News Farm provides food for the various projects.
- The Sonbong Bread Company provides fresh bread daily for children in nurseries and kindergartens. The goal is to serve 4000 children daily.
- The Sonbong Soymilk Company in partnership with CRAM produces soymilk for children in daycare, kindergarten and first grade. Their goal is to provide free soymilk to 7500 children daily.

The Kims see their work as a "miracle in progress." They walk by faith and count it a privilege to serve in these countries.
