If you have ever been on a mission trip then you understand the value of prayer support. If you have never had that experience, it is really difficult to try to explain; however, I want you to know that your prayers made all the difference in the world. We both stayed very healthy throughout the entire trip. We were safe through all of our modes of transportation which included 14 plane flights, rides in cars, vans, trucks, a horse-drawn wooden cart, a boat, a three-wheel taxi, a motorcycle, taxis and ... well I think you get the picture. We never felt threatened or in danger in any way.

IN ADDITION, YOUR PRAYERS WERE ANSWERED FOR OUR SPIRITUAL protection and perseverance. Yes, we were in a place that is predominately Buddhist. We were in places that were extremely õdarkö spiritually. However, we were never in a place where we did not find believers and followers of the Lord Jesus Christ. We were welcomed into home after home and shown gracious hospitality everywhere we went. Many of the homes were what many in our culture might call õshacks,ö but for the people who lived there, it was their home. We respected it as such and were very grateful for every opportunity to visit in each place.

THE LORD ALLOWED US THE AMAZING PRIVILEGE of seeing people commit their lives to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. There is nothing more beautiful in all the earth than to look into the eyes of a person as he or she comes to understand that Jesus is their Savior and that their sins are forgiven. In the been so blessed in my life to have traveled to several different places in the world and that look is so beautiful every time regardless of the color of one skin or the language one speaks. It is such a blessing to share with brothers and sisters in Christ from other backgrounds, cultures, nations, languages, races, etc.

I THANK THE LORD FOR THE LEADERS God is raising up in the country. We were blessed to be able to spend some time with some of them while there. I preached in a house church on our first Sunday and Mark preached in a church building our second Sunday there. It was such a blessing to worship with fellow believers in their language and in their ministry context.

I WANT TO ENCOURAGE YOU TO CONTINUE TO PRAY for the new believers to grow in their faith. Pray for leaders who can follow up with the new believers and encourage them in their faith. On the Mark for Missions

"Christ wants not nibblers of the possible, but grabbers of the impossible."

C. T. Studd, 19th/20th century English missionary to China, India and the Congo

Okay, itøs time to throw in the towel . . . say ¿Uncleø. . . wave a white flag . . . surrender. The spiritual lostness is too intense; the darkness too dense. The task of making disciples of all nations is impossible! In America, the Church has lost her influence; we live in a post-Christian nation with more than a quarter of a billion lost people living on our continent. This makes North American the worldøs 4th largest mission field! How can we even wrap our minds ó much less get our hands ó around that reality? Impossible! In Southeast Asia the first half of February, I felt overwhelmed by the enormity of the task God is asking us to embrace ó to fulfill the Great Commission among the T-People. Now we know that more than half-a-million T-People exist with no church using their language or reflecting their culture. And, we are aware of only a few dozen followers of Jesus most of whom have not reached the spiritual development level of children in our preschool Sunday school classes! How can we even comprehend this situation much less develop a strategy to overcome it? Impossible! Perhaps itøs time to write off North America. Maybe we should forget we ever heard of T-People. Why not? The mission of God is messy, inconvenient, expensive, and . . . impossible!

Yet, I keep reading in my Bible about situations where God demonstrated the truth Jesus repeated: "What is impossible with man is possible with God." (Luke 18:27) Moses and the Israelites faced an impossible situation with the Red Sea on one side and the Egyptian army on the other. You might say they were between the devil and the deep blue sea! Yet, in response to their cry, God acted in dramatic fashion to accomplish the impossible. Im sure younge read the story recently as we read through the Bible together. But, if you missed it, the story is recorded in Exodus 14. There we discover why God led His people into an impossible situation: "I will gain glory for myself through Pharaoh and all his army, and the Egyptians will know that I am the Lord." (14:4) As Pastor Rick reminded us recently, God calls us to take on the impossible so that, when the task is accomplished, He receives the glory of everyone knows that He is the one who has made possible the impossible! That why, as C. T. Studd realized, one of the impossible, but grabbers of the impossible."

During March, I invite you to call on God to make possible the impossible tasks of reaching North America with the Gospel and of fulfilling the Great Commission among the T-People. Will you please dive wholeheartedly into two significant emphases we'll share this month? Ask God to do a great work among us and through us on behalf of our nation of the people among whom we live of and on behalf of the unreached people group He is directing us to engage?

Pray earnestly during the *Week of Prayer for North American Missions*, March 4 ó 11; and, give generously to the *Annie Armstrong Easter Offering* for the sake of the Gospel in the United States, Canada and our national Territories. Seek God on behalf of the 5,000 + North American mission personnel and their partners who are planting churches, meeting human needs in Jesusø Name, and expanding Christøs Kingdom across our continent.

Participate enthusiastically in our *T-People Celebration Sunday* on March 25 during which we have opportunity to commit ourselves to fulfilling the Great Commission among this people group previously unengaged with the Gospel. Pour your heart out on behalf of this people group we are learning to love. Ask God, õWhat part can I play in your plan to make Jesus known among the T-People?ö Then, say, õYesö, to what God says.

The task to which we have been called is an impossible one. But, it is not time to give up on what we can do. Rather, it is time to gear up for what only God can do. And, God is doing great things. I hear stories of Church Family members investing their lives in outsiders like Gospel skeptics, unwed mothers, substance abusers, and homeless people. I know of people praying for unreached people groups like the T-People. I can tell people are giving their resources to meet people material as well as their greatest need for salvation. I see people responding to God call by embracing His mission both in their neighborhoods and half a world away. How exciting! These choices show how God people grabbing the impossible and trusting the God of possibilities to make it happen! That is awesome indeed!

Good Friday, April 6th
"The Cross and Suffering"

Suffering is a sobering reality in a fallen world. Followers of Christ are not immune to adversity and affliction. On the contrary, there is a real sense in which following Christ means that trials and tribulations are more likely to come our way. As a result, whether walking through sickness, sorrow, pain, or persecution, the questions abound: Why am I suffering? Where is God when I suffer? How can I suffer well? When will my suffering end? How can God be good and allow such evil in the world? How can God be gracious and ordain such suffering in my life? During this Secret Church on Good Friday, we will explore these extremely profound yet deeply personal questions through the lens of Christos sufferings on the cross. In the process, we will come to a surprising discovery of how the gospel strengthens, sustains, supports, and ultimately satisfies us in the middle of suffering.

Join us on April 6th from 7:00 pm till 1:00 am for an intense time of Bible study and prayer for our persecuted brothers and sisters around the world. Cost is \$5 per person. STUDENT MINISTRY

The students at Old Town Baptist Church over the past month and several weeks have become a crew of Traders. Before you begin to question the loyalty of the middle and high schoolers roaming the halls, let me explain to you how awesome of a commitment this is. Over the past several weeks at Converge we went through a series called õSurrenderö where we were challenged to Surrender: Stuff, Status, Sin, and Self for the sake of pursuing Christ. At the end of the series, the students were able to make a commitment to become õTradersö in which they traded what society tells them is important in these areas, for the truth of Scripture. The mission we have developed and pray to live out as oTraderso is: "A movement that requires us to live out our faith, not just talk about it. We must choose daily to sacrifice and be intentional with our time, money, and skills. We hate injustice – and find specific ways to bring the hope in Jesus to desperate situations. We use our God given passions and skills with excellence. We act swiftly, because the time is RIGHT NOW. The result is a generation of traders making choices that are Kingdom focused and not self-focused - so that our short time here has an eternal impact." Itos a bold statement for the society that we are engulfed in, but the Bible tells us that this will be difficult and that we have to deny ourselves and daily pick up our cross to follow Him (Luke 9:23-24). Our students are passionate and courageous in living faithfully and we would all continue to covet your prayers for them as they live this out on their campuses. We are currently in the process of evaluating the gifts and passions that God has given them and how they match up with the burdens that God has placed on their hearts. It is our goal to spread the Gospel by serving the needs of the community that God has entrusted to us and reaching it with the Truth of Christ. Several things that are upcoming for the month of March ó First, we will be hosting a simulcast called oLove Costs Everythingo which is a student-based film produced by The Voice of the Martyrs that details the realities of the persecuted church around the world. This will be showing on Wednesday, March 7th from 6:30-9pm. My hope is that parents will come with their students so that we can all learn together what our Christian brothers and sisters throughout the world endure daily for the faith. I believe that this will be an eye opening and faith-strengthening experience that I hope everyone can be a part of. Second, we are taking a trip to Charlotte on March 23-24th for the oReach Your Worldo youth conference. This conference will have awe some worship and biblical teaching that will be a great blessing to those who can attend. The cost of this trip is \$40 plus food, and we will leave Friday afternoon, stay the night, and return Saturday evening. Finally, a reminder about this summer as Camp Caswell for rising 7th-12th graders, our dates are June 18th-23rd. There are sign-up slips outside of the youth room that can be completed and returned to me with the \$50 deposit to secure a spot to join us. This is sure to be an awesome week that Imm already looking forward to, so please go ahead and get those slips turned in as soon as you're able. As always, I look forward to seeing our students at Converge on Wednesday nights and being active in their D-Groups on Sunday evenings. ~I thank God for these students and the opportunity to grow and serve Him alongside them. Please continue to pray for us as we continue to dive into His word and strive to live out a Christ-Centered life. ~
