"True Happiness" Matthew 5:3-12

The Beatitudes are eight blessings recounted in the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel of Matthew. The term beatitude comes from the Latin noun beatitude which means "happiness".

In the biblical context blessedness descri	ribes happiness that comes from a right
relationship with	as opposed to a more material understanding of
good fortune or emotional bliss. This kir	nd of happiness is supreme.

Paradox of Happiness

(Mark 8:35) If you try to hang on to your life, you will lose it. But if you give up your life for my sake and for the sake of the Good News, you will save it.

Rene Breuel, "Happiness comes as the consequence of an outward facing posture. Only when we transcend the prisons of self can we enlarge our hearts to savor the full breadth of life's delights."

JESUS HIMSELF is the greatest message and the greatest revelation.

(Ephesians 1:5) God decided in advance to adopt us into his own family by bringing us to **himself** through Jesus Christ. This is what he wanted to do, and it gave him great pleasure.

Blessedness should not	be seen as a reward for religious accomplishments, but as an act
of God's	in believers' lives. Rather than congratulating them or
spiritual or moral achiev	rements, the beatitude underscores the fact that sinners stand
within a forgiving relation	onship made possible by Christ's atonement.
