A Story of Forgiveness

Do you have a rival or an enemy? Is there another person at school or in your neighborhood who is always teasing, or bullying, or pranking you? Or maybe they're always out scoring you on your tests, or outracing you in PE. We've all got people who just rub us the wrong way.

The Bible tells us to love our enemies. To pray for the people who use you. That sounds like a pretty odd and difficult thing. But the Bible reminds us that God has forgiven us. And if we

can remember how much God has forgiven us, we can forgive others who do wrong to us.

Last week we looked at the passage right before this one about getting along when we disagree. This must be an important thing, because Jesus talks about it so much. In the Lord's prayer, Jesus tells us to pray "forgive us our debits as we forgive our debtors." He tells us that the mark of His disciples is how we love one another, even the people we don't get along with very well.
