To Make Him Known to Whomever

We, as people, are really good at grouping ourselves, and then making ourselves proud of our groups. We think things like our grade is the best grade at our school, and our school is the best school. Boys think boys are cooler than girls, and girls think boys are crazy.

We are all different and it's easy to like people who are a lot like you. They like watching and talking about the same movies or sports (or whatever) that we do. It's a lot harder to like people who are different.

But God calls us to love our neighbors, even the ones that are weird, or unpopular, or mean.

Peter and those first Christians were all Jews. They were God's chosen people. Everyone else were "gentiles", that means people who aren't spiritually "clean". They didn't even think gentiles could become Christians.

Then God led Peter to a Roman soldier's house to tell him and his family about Jesus. Peter chose to go, and he was amazed when the Holy Spirit showed up.
