Mark 4:26-34

Seeds

When was the last time you had to get new shoes because your old shoes were just too small? Have you ever dug out an old favorite t-shirt only to find that it doesn't fit anymore? Have you ever watched in the mirror just to see if you could notice that you're growing.

Jesus told a number of parables that feature seeds. We're going to look at just a couple of them this week. He says that the Kingdom of God is like a seed. When it's planted in your heart it begins to grow.

Just like a real seed, or you for that matter, you often don't notice it growing, especially when you're really impatient for it to happen. But it *is* growing. You are growing up. You're not just getting taller, you're getting smarter. You're learning more. You're getting wiser.

Do you have a garden? Do you have some potted plants in your house? What can you do to help seeds grow? What can you do to help the seed of God's Kingdom grow in your heart, in your family, in the world?
