"Why Is Work Such Work?" Mark 2:23–3:6

God created work to be life giving. Gen. 1:28, Isaiah 64:4, I Corinthians 3:9

But work can become destructive.

What are the banks, the boundaries that keep work as a life giving flow? Mark 2:27

What is Sabbath? Exodus 20:8-11

Sabbath helps us keep life and work within the proper boundaries. How?

Work becomes destructive when work becomes separated from our life in God.

Sabbath reminds us God is our Source.

Work becomes destructive when it becomes our ultimate provider.

Sabbath reminds us that God is our Provider.

Work becomes destructive when it enslaves us and others.

Sabbath reminds us that God has freed us from slavery, from slavery to more.
