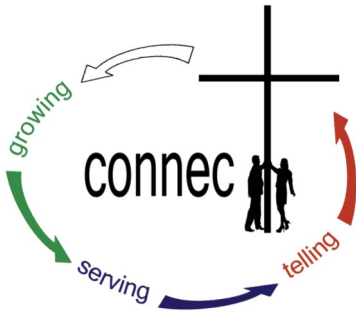

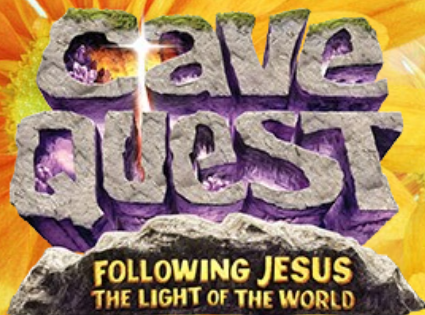

## *Staying Connected to Jesus*

*I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. John 15:5*

## *“What If...!”*

In a recent message I made a statement which several members since have told me, “Say it again Pastor, we need to be reminded.” So I’m saying it again here in print. What I said was this:

*“What if God removed His presence and blessings from us during the summer months? What would happen to us? We would perish! That being said dear friends, then **do not remove** yourselves from HIS PRESENCE during the summer months. Omitting worship of God during the summer months is conforming to the world (check out Romans 12:2) and doing exactly what the devil wants us to do.”*

Oh, I very much understand that the summer schedule is different for it includes vacation time and for some weekends at the lake and these things are good; but not God pleasing if we use them as an excuse for not worshipping the God who provides all (money, possessions, family, health, job, home, etc) that we tend to call our own. Jesus who puts us first at all times and sacrificed His very own life for our salvation reminds us in Matthew 6:33 to keep Him first in our lives:

*“Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things I’ll give to you as well.”*

Some say, “I don’t have to worship God in church, I can worship Him anywhere.” That statement is only partially right. It is true we can worship God anywhere AND our faith response **is to worship** God everywhere! This we do when we live our lives by the Word of God, modeling our faith and telling others about Jesus. That’s worship in the broad sense of the term. Worship in the narrow sense, as God refers to in the third commandment, is to come together with fellow believers in forms of worship which does not happen in the broad sense. What are those forms? Hearing the Word of God, Law & Gospel, truthfully proclaimed and applied.

- ❖ Confession of sins and hearing the announcement of God’s forgiveness.
- ❖ Reception of Holy Communion
- ❖ Support of fellow Christians who pray for us, laugh and cry with us.
- ❖ Opportunities to serve God.
- ❖ Praising God in song with fellow believers.

No one “has to” worship God in Church. However, where faith in Jesus has taken root in the heart there is a desire to **WANT TO** worship God to praise and thank Him and to receive His Grace and guidance from His Word.

The Bible, Old and New Testaments are filled with passages which encourage, command, and invite God’s people to worship Him in the narrow sense of the word. I encourage you to read and study them; a few of those references are listed below:

- Exodus 20:8-11 3<sup>rd</sup> commandment where regular weekly worship of God and rest for the body is commanded.
- 2 Chronicles 30:8 Submit to God and come to His House of Worship
- Psalm 27:4 King David says to seek God in His House and come to gaze upon the Beauty of the Lord.
- Psalm 122:1 People invited and encouraged people to worship and David responded with Joy.
- Ecclesiastes 5:1 Attitude check! Come to God's House to listen to what HE says for your life.
- Acts 2:42-47 The early Christians were **devoted** to being with fellow Christians and hearing God's Word and these verses list many resultant blessings.
- Romans 10:17 Faith comes from hearing the Word about Jesus.
- Hebrews 10:23-25 Don't get out of the habit of worship-check out here some of the things you are missing.
- Colossians 3:16 These verses describe some of the forms of worship chief among them is the "Word of Christ" dwelling in us.

These verses are just a sampling of the many which speak about the value, blessings, and purpose of worship with fellow Christians.

I look forward to seeing you either on Sunday 9AM or Wednesday 7PM during the summer. And when you are unable to be here, find a church in the lakes area or the place you are vacationing to worship, praise and thank the God of our salvation who daily gives Abundant Spiritual and Physical Blessings.

## MIND, BODY, and SPIRIT

Psoriasis<sup>1</sup> is a chronic skin disease of scaling and inflammation that affects greater than 3 percent of the U.S. population, or more than 5 million adults. It appears about equally in males and females. Psoriasis occurs when skin cells quickly rise from their origin below the surface of the skin and pile up on the surface before they have a chance to mature. Usually this movement (also called turnover) takes about a month, but in psoriasis it may occur in only a few days.

[Psoriasis](#) is a non-contagious inflammatory [skin](#) disease. The symptoms include clearly defined red patches, scaly skin and [itching](#). This condition typically starts in adulthood, and comes and goes in cycles of [flare](#)-ups and symptom-free phases. This means that the skin can get better on its own, but it may also suddenly get worse.

In its typical form, psoriasis results in patches of thick, red (inflamed) skin covered with silvery scales. These patches, which are sometimes referred to as plaques, usually itch or feel sore. They most often occur on the elbows, knees, other parts of the legs, scalp, lower back, face, palms, and soles of the feet, but they can occur on skin anywhere on the body. The disease may also affect the fingernails, the toenails, and the soft tissues of the genitals, and inside the mouth. Although it is not unusual for the skin around affected joints to crack, some people with psoriasis experience joint inflammation that produces symptoms of arthritis. This condition is called psoriatic arthritis.

Psoriasis cannot currently be cured. It often has a real psychological and social impact on people's lives. Individuals with psoriasis may experience significant physical discomfort and some disability. Itching and pain can interfere with basic functions, such as self-care, walking, and sleep. Plaques on hands and feet can prevent individuals from working at certain occupations, playing some sports, and caring for family members or a home. The frequency of medical care is costly and can interfere with an employment or school schedule. People with moderate to severe psoriasis may feel self-conscious about their appearance and have a poor self-image that stems from fear of public rejection and concerns about intimate relationships. Psychological distress can lead to significant depression and social isolation.

### Treatment

There are many different [treatment](#) options for [psoriasis](#) and usually first treated by applying ointments, creams or lotions to the [skin](#). If this is not effective enough, different types of phototherapy can be used. Phototherapy involves exposing skin to artificial [UV rays](#). The skin's sensitivity to light can be increased for phototherapy by using creams, bath salts or [oral](#) tablets.

A combination of bathing and [UV light therapy](#) is also often used. This involves bathing in warm water for about 20 minutes. The water either has a large amount of salt in it or has had certain substances added to it. People's [skin](#) is exposed to artificial UV light while bathing, or immediately afterwards. If these [treatments](#) do not help enough, or if the condition becomes more severe, various medications can be used. Please contact me with any questions.

The quilters had a very successful year. We were able to give quilts to the following:

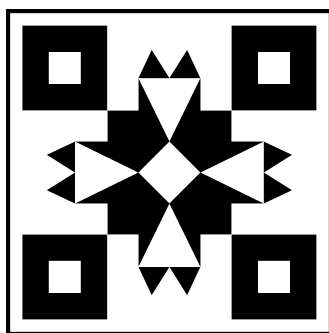
