PARENTING HOMEWORK

It's your kids who are heading back to school in the coming days. Because youth culture is changing at breakneck speed, the school they're going back to isn't the one they left when summer vacation began just a few short weeks ago. Think about it. For example, Pokémon Go was unknown in June. Now it's taken the world by storm. And while most kids are engaged with it, most parents are ignorant to it. That's why you're getting these parental homework assignments.

As a parent, you have been given primary responsibility for the spiritual nurture of your children (Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Ephesians 6:4). Because you grew up in a world that's different from the world of your teen, you must view this calling as a cross-cultural missionary venture. As a result, you must work to stay in touch - like foreign missionaries - with the language and culture of your mission field. Here are three assignments that aren't meant to be burdensome, but helpful.

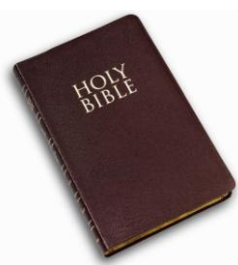
First, take the advice of the theologian who once said that every Christian should start their day with the Bible in one hand, and the newspaper in the other. In other words, you must begin your day spending time getting to know the One who has sent you, and the message that One has called you to communicate to your kids. Be sure that God's truth is coursing through your veins. Then, take the time to use your newspaper to get to know today's world so that you can communicate the Word's truths to the needs of your teenager and his/her world.

Second, read what they read, watch what they watch, and listen to what they listen to. Because of its pervasiveness, media is now the most powerful shaper of the values, attitudes, and behaviors of teens. What media are your teens engaging with, and what are they hearing/seeing/learning as they engage with those media? You can only know by checking it out for yourself. By getting to know your teen's media, you are getting to know your kids. Knowing their media will offer you great opportunities to discuss life in the light of God's Word. You will be able to affirm what they are learning that conforms to God's will and way, and challenge those things that don't.

Finally, spend time perusing the Center for Parent/Youth Understanding (www.cpyu.org), website. We've worked hard to create an online community where you can find valuable information on teenagers and their world that's updated daily, growing archives of searchable information on youth culture, and dozens of links to other helpful organizations that deal with every conceivable type of youth culture pressure and reality.

As your teen heads back to school, decide that you're going to go back to school as well. If you become a serious student of your teen's culture, your teen will find it easier to navigate the hallways of that culture in a manner that glorifies God.

MIND, BODY, and SPIRIT

This information has been provided by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration as they recently finalized a rule that extends its regulatory authority to all tobacco products, including e-cigarettes, cigars, and hookah and pipe tobacco, as part of its goal to improve public health. “Before this final rule, these products could be sold without any review of their ingredients, how they were made, and their potential dangers,” explains Mitch Zeller, J.D., director of the FDA’s Center for Tobacco Products. “Under this new rule, we’re taking steps to protect Americans from the dangers of tobacco products, ensure these tobacco products have health warnings, and restrict sales to minors.”

What does this new rule do? The FDA has regulated cigarettes, cigarette tobacco, roll-your-own tobacco, and smokeless tobacco products since June 2009, after Congress passed and the President signed the Family Smoking Prevention and Tobacco Control Act. This Act gave the agency authority to regulate the manufacturing, distribution, and marketing of tobacco products. Today, the rule does several things. It extends the FDA’s regulatory authority to all tobacco products, including e-cigarettes—which are also called electronic cigarettes or electronic nicotine delivery systems (ENDS)—all cigars (including premium ones), hookah (also called waterpipe tobacco), pipe tobacco, nicotine gels, and dissolvables that did not previously fall under the FDA’s authority. It requires health warnings on roll-your-own tobacco, cigarette tobacco, and certain newly regulated tobacco products and also bans free samples. In addition, because of the rule, manufacturers of newly regulated tobacco products that were not on the market as of February 15, 2007, will have to show that products meet the applicable public health standard set by the law. And those manufacturers will have to receive marketing authorization from the FDA. The new rule also restricts youth access to newly regulated tobacco products by: 1) not allowing products to be sold to those younger than 18 and requiring age verification via photo ID; and 2) not allowing tobacco products to be sold in vending machines (unless in an adult-only facility).

Nursing Students at Our Redeemer: We are excited to have four Concordia nursing students working with Collette for a few hours this fall. Megan, Kristen, Emily, and Taylor are senior nursing students who are completing part of their public health clinical by working within the faith community nurse setting during their fall semester. They will be helping with blood pressure screenings, checking in with the CCC, helping maintain first aid equipment at ORLC, and providing education. Please welcome them if you happen to see them. Thank you! ☺

Why did the FDA take this action? The FDA’s goal is to protect Americans from tobacco-related disease and death. Tobacco use is a major threat to public health. It’s important to note that FDA regulation of these products does not mean they are safe to use. But before this rule, there was no federal law to stop retailers from selling e-cigarettes, hookah, or cigars to youth under age 18. There has been a major drop in the use of traditional cigarettes among youth over the past decade, but their use of other tobacco products is rising. Current e-cigarette use among high school students has skyrocketed from 1.5 percent in 2011 to 16 percent in 2015 (a more than 900 percent increase) and hookah use has risen significantly, according to a survey supported by the FDA and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. This rule allows the FDA to protect youth by restricting their access to tobacco products.

What product characteristics will the FDA review? The tobacco product review process allows the FDA to evaluate important factors such as ingredients, product design and health risks, as well as products’ appeal to youth and non-users.

What’s the bottom line? The rule will help prevent young people from starting to use these products, help consumers better understand the risks of using these products, prohibit false and misleading product claims, and prevent new tobacco products from being marketed unless a manufacturer demonstrates that the products meet the relevant public health standard.

But aren't e-cigarettes safer than regular cigarettes? The FDA recognizes that some tobacco products have the potential to be less harmful than others. But more evidence is needed. The agency is exploring this issue with respect to tobacco regulation. The FDA believes that this new technology has both potential benefits and risks. If certain products, such as e-cigarettes, have reduced toxicity compared to conventional cigarettes; encourage current smokers to switch completely; and/or are not widely used by youth, they may have the potential to reduce disease and death. But if any product prompts young people to become addicted to nicotine, reduces a person's interest in quitting cigarettes, and/or leads to long-term usage with other tobacco products, the public health impact could be negative. The FDA encourages manufacturers to explore product innovations that would maximize potential benefits and minimize risks. The final rule allows the FDA to further evaluate and assess the impact of these products on the health of both users and non-users. And it lets the FDA regulate the products based on the most current scientific knowledge.

So which products can help me quit using tobacco? The FDA has approved a variety of products as cessation aids to help reduce your dependence on nicotine. Products include nicotine gum, nicotine skin patches, nicotine lozenges, nicotine oral inhaled products, and nicotine nasal spray as well as non-nicotine medications called varenicline and bupropion. You can also get free help quitting by calling 1-800-QUIT-NOW or by visiting www.smokefree.gov. More information regarding smoking cessation, e-cigarettes, and FDA regulation can be found on the Health and Healing bulletin board by the mailboxes.

One Sunday offering remains as I write this, my final update for The Record. We have about \$3,500.00 in bills remaining to be paid by October 1st. An average offering should cover that amount and get us started on October payroll and benefits. Ten thousand dollars from the Budget Support account is still being used in the General Account to keep us current.

As building & maintenance issues continue, it may be difficult to get that money back into savings by year end. The average weekly offering through August is \$9013.34 and the average weekly expenses are \$9312.43 putting us \$10,468.27 behind for the year. September offerings look to be on target to meet this year's average. I wish I was leaving my position with no money worries for the congregation but God has a plan.

A word of thanks for all the support I have had while in this position. There has always been an abundance of encouragement and support as together we've dealt with the financial issues of an active congregation. I will miss my time in the office but am ready to let go of the structured deadlines required for some of the office processes. For those of you who don't know, I will be moving from Moorhead to Herman, MN for possibly a couple years. I will be keeping my membership at Our Redeemer so will return as I'm able for worship and to keep in touch with my many friends. May God continue to bless the staff and members of Our Redeemer.
