



OSLC Parish Planning Council Meeting Highlights for Tuesday, June 18, 2013

Treasurer's Report

For May, actual income was over budget by \$3150.23 and actual expenses under budget by \$3825.82. There was a one-time deposit made by one family which inflated the income. YTD numbers show an overage of \$4154.28.

Pastor's Report

Pastoral acts included 5 Sunday worship services and 13 pastoral visitations/appointments. Pastor Becky presided over the baptisms of Witten David Powers and Elise Carola Gist, 1st communion for Jill Powers, and graveside services Lu Tasky and Norman Nelson. Her meeting schedule included Wednesday morning Bible studies, Wednesday evening Deacons meetings and Bible study, weekly staff meetings, CAT meeting, NEMN synod meeting and Interim Pastors meeting. Anticipating the events of the call process, her last day at OSLC will be July 14th. Pastor Becky thanked the PPC leaders and officers for hospitality, leadership and commitment to God's ministry. A message to the congregation appears in the *Messenger*.

Team Leader Reports

<u>Christian Education</u> - A third Family Fun night will be held on June 20 at 5:30 at Washington Elementary playground and the July Fun Night will be held in conjunction with the Church Picnic on July 10. The Team has been looking at Sunday School curriculum for next year and considering budget implications.

<u>Church Properties</u> - The authorized roof repairs have been completed by Commercial Roofing. Stack Brothers was awarded the bid for the boiler project. Work should start July 1 and take 3-4 weeks.

The PPC approved an additional \$8200 to install digital controls in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall to allow programming temperature according to occupancy.

<u>Deacons</u> – The three new Deacons are Dennis Painter, Irene Rudnicki and Dean Haglin. They are attending the weekly Wednesday night Deacon's meetings beginning this month and will serve terms of years.

<u>Fellowship Team</u> - The summer outdoor service and picnic will be held on July 10, rain or shine. Food will be served starting at 5:30 with a short service from 6:30 -7:00. The team will plan the Welcome reception in the Fellowship Hall for our new pastor on his first Sunday and also for the installation event when scheduled.

<u>Youth Ministry</u> - On behalf of the youth, blessings and thanks to all who support their activities, especially the upcoming mission trip. Tim Boetcher is the second adult chaperone going on the trip. The group has scheduled a Bean Bag tournament for Sunday, June 23rd at 11:30 to raise some additional funds for the trip. Additional summer youth activities can be found in the *Messenger*. They include: Softball Monday nights at Pinehurst Park, Youth group Wednesdays at 7:00, Camp Vermilion June 14-19, Young Life Camp July 21-27, Summer Stretch with Zion on June 25, July 23 and 30, Day Camp on August 5-9 with Zion.

Worship, Arts and Music – Three 9:30 Sunday worship services have been held under the summer schedule. Attendance has been good and there have been positive comments. On Sunday, June 23, the Praise Team will lead the worship music. Pastor Chris Hill and his wife Sandy will be in attendance. Recent issues with the CAT7 video broadcast are being resolved. The WAM team and Praise & Worship Team will provide music for the outdoor picnic on July 10.

<u>WELCA</u> - The cleaning of the carpet in the Fellowship Hall and adjoining Sunday School room has been completed. There are steps being taken to refurbish first aid kits in the office and kitchen.

<u>Mission Endowment</u> – Since there were no withdrawals in 2012 and 2013, there is \$11,685 in the Fund designated and available for the boiler fund.

CAPITAL PROJECTS FUNDRAISING: Don't recognize the title? That's because we have decided to combine different physical needs of the Church into one category, one effort, one new title!

Most of you are familiar by now with the need to replace the boiler that heats our building. Our current unit is leaking and will not last another year. Therefore, we are transitioning to new, more efficient technology both in terms of gas boilers as well as support systems. Bids were supplied by three contractors and the lowest was selected. The first part of the project was the disassembly of the current unit to determine the cause of failure. That began in early July and the analysis that will determine whether any of the replacement cost is covered by insurance will probably be completed in August. Church Treasurer Jeannine Nordin is researching loan options to cover the immediate costs.

Meanwhile, a committee has been formed under the leadership of Church Vice President Jon Lamb, to organize fundraising to pay off the anticipated boiler loan. However, as mentioned above, this is not the only physical need that our facility has. We have talked for quite some time about the pending roof repair/replacement that is now only a few short years away. While there have been many other capital projects discussed, these two present us with an immediate need (boiler) and a need that is pretty close, but not immediate...yet (roof). These two projects are now the basis for this CAPITAL PROJECTS FUNDRAISING.

While we know the boiler project cost will be between \$90,000 and \$100,000, because the roof requirements have not been determined as yet, we only know the amount will be significant, certainly beyond annual budget constraints. We don't have any debt remaining on our building and the ELCA has loan programs for such needs, so we believe a loan will be achievable. To help both pay off that loan and prepare us for the roof project of the not-too-distant future we are accumulating ideas for fundraising that currently include:

- Pledge campaign that will span several years to break down the loan into manageable annual pieces so as to not adversely affect the operating budget.
- Special one-time or annual events with funds raised pledged towards capital needs
- Requests of organizations that use our building to help financially in this special time of need
- Other (this would be a good place for you to put your ideas!)

There is a Designated Fund set up for Capital Projects that already has over \$1,000 in it. In addition, the OSLC Endowment Fund has pledged both 2012's and 2013's special allowable distributions to this fundraising project (the two years' total contribution to this effort is over \$11,600). Future discussion by Church leadership will determine whether other assets can or should be allocated to this as well. So, what can you do to help YOUR church at this special time? Oh, let me count the ways:

- 1. Pray, pray, pray that God will both guide our efforts and touch the hearts of all who hear our story, that each will consider their own capability to help both financially and as a volunteer.
- 2. While we build momentum towards an opening event in early fall, consider a contribution to the Capital Projects Designated Fund NOW! Simply indicate on your envelope or check that you wish your contribution be so restricted.
- 3. Pray, pray, pray...oh, did I say that already? Never hurts...
- 4. Consider planning and/or hosting an event, the proceeds of which go towards this effort.
- 5. Talk up the fundraising effort with members of any Church teams you are on, your Church friends, even your relatives and neighbors. And if good old fashioned Lutheran guilt doesn't do the trick, remind them any contribution is tax deductible. Tell them the former treasurer sent you.

Take a look at the monthly Church calendar of events in the Messenger. Look at all the cars in the lot on a weeknight. Lots of local people use our building to do good things for our kids, our neighbors, our community. Ours is not just a church building, it is a COMMUNITY building that we offer up to most any non-profit organization out to do good. If you belong to an organization looking to give back to the community, consider helping fix one of the largest, most used, community buildings in the county by contributing to the effort.

In the end, one caution that you have heard me say many times before as Treasurer: We have a day-to-day budget to pay our employees, run our Church, support our Christian endeavors. We can't simply switch our contributions from regular offering to the Capital Projects Fund or daily operations are shortchanged. PLEASE prayerfully consider all of the opportunities listed above to help this effort, but PLEASE make any financial contribution or commitment IN ADDITION TO (not in place of) your current support.

On behalf of the Capital Projects Fund Committee I say THANK YOU for all you do for Our Savior's Lutheran Church.

PPC HIGHLIGHTS

Old Business:

<u>Capital Fund Drive</u> – The drive will be broken down into Phase I for the Boiler Replacement, then Phase II for Roof Repairs. Each Ministry Team should provide the name of a liaison person to communicate with the Fund Drive Committee about smaller fund-raising opportunities and efforts.

<u>The Altar Repair Project</u> will be the subject of a Temple Talk and article in the *Messenger*. In recent months, communion has not included kneeling at the rail, which has some cracks and presents a safety issue. Donations and assistance will be requested in the amount of \$1500-\$2000 for the repair.

<u>Candidate of Choice</u> Pastor Chris Hill and his wife Sandy will be here to worship with us on June 23. There will be information about him in the service bulletin and in the *Messenger*. Tentatively he may start on

August 9th in the office and preach on the 19th. Pulpit supply will be needed for the month hiatus between pastors.

New Business:

<u>Pastor Becky's last Sunday</u> will be followed by a special coffee hour. During the worship service, Pastor Becky will have a short blessing entitled "Ending the Call".

On-line Church Directory – After discussion of several options, Juli Lattner was asked to look into the Life Touch vendor's option for providing an on-line directory for the church.

Benefit Package for Pastor Chris Hill - the PPC recommended approval of the compensation package to be offered to the candidate of choice. At the June 30 special congregation meeting, in agreement with our constitution, there will be a secret (paper ballot) vote to *approve the call* to the candidate of choice and a second vote, *to approve the compensation*, with a voice vote requiring a simple majority.

Adjournment - The meeting adjourned at 8:30 with the Lord's Prayer.

The next PPC meeting is scheduled for July 16 at 7:00 in the Fireside Room.

OSLC Special Congregational Meeting Summary June 30, 2013

President Sue Stahl called the meeting to order at 10:45 am and opened with a short prayer. Mary Krohn, member of the Call Committee, reviewed the steps that have been taken in the call process since it began. Linda Holmstrand, Secretary, confirmed that a quorum (minimum of 25) was present at the meeting, with 103 congregation members signing in.

There were two items on the agenda:

- I. In accordance with the OSLC Constitution C9.01 and ByLaw s BL3.01, the congregation must approve the selection of a pastor by a two-thirds majority vote. A motion was made, seconded and approved to issue a Letter of Call to Pastor Chris Hill to serve as Senior Pastor at OSLC. A written ballot vote was taken with overwhelming support for the motion.
- II. In accordance with OSLC ByLaw BL3.02, once the congregation has voted to call a pastor by a 2/3 majority, it will then have a second vote to approve the compensation and benefit package. An information sheet outlining the compensation recommended by the Council Advisory Team (CAT) and the Parish Planning Council (PPC) for Pastor Hill was distributed to the voting members. After questions, comments and discussion, a motion was made and seconded to approve the total compensation package.

With final details of pastoral coverage to be worked out by the CAT, it is anticipated that Pastor Hill will be beginning his ministry here in mid-August. Pastor Becky will be departing one month before his arrival.
