Watt's Up:

“God Speaks To Give Me Direction & Correction!”



Power Verse:

“If you reject discipline, you only harm yourself; but if you listen to correction, you grow in understanding.” - **Proverbs 15:32**

This week we continue our series “God Speaks.” God is speaking, but what is He saying? This is the question we talked about in this week’s lesson.

Ask:

- What was the name of the mean king we talked about this week?
- How did God choose to speak to Him?
- How do you think you would respond if God wrote something on a wall for you?

Say:

We would probably be pretty shocked if God decided to speak to us by writing on a wall, but God wanted to get the King’s attention because He was trying to correct him for something wrong he was doing. God will speak to you for a variety of different reasons if you are listening.

Ask:

- What are some of the reasons God speaks to us? (correction, direction, etc)
- What is something you can think of that maybe God has told you to do? Did you listen and obey?
- Is it always easy to obey what God is telling us to do?

Say:

God speaks because He has something he wants to tell us. Often it is because He is trying to direct us or correct us and help us follow Him and stay on the right path. God loves us enough that He wants to guide us by speaking to us. He doesn’t just leave us to figure life out on our own. Instead, He speaks to us. We just have to be listening!

Pray:

Pray together about things that God may be speaking to you as individuals or as a family to do that require you to listen and obey. Pray that each member of your family will listen to what God is saying!
