

he word "hypocrite" as used in Scripture, means "one who plays the role of another; one who appears to be something he or she is not.' In fact the word comes from a Greek term that refers to actors playing the role of another on stage,

usually while wearing a mask, just like a façade.

Jesus use of the word, especially in Matthew 23:13,23,25,2-29 and verse 28 makes it clear that He regarded a hypocrite as one who was all appearance and no substance. "So you also outwardly appear righteous



The Queen Mary was the largest ship to cross the oceans when it was launched in 1936. Through four decades and a World War she served until she was retired, anchored in Long Beach, California. During her conversion into a floating hotel, her three massive smokestacks were removed, to be scraped down and repainted, but on the dock they crumbled. Nothing was left of the 3/4" steel plate from which the stacks had been made from. All that remained were more than thirty coats of paint had been applied over the

> years. The steel inside had completely rusted away.

Let us strive to be real. Let us make sure that we are on the inside what we appear to be on the outside. Let's not be all paint and no smokestack! □


