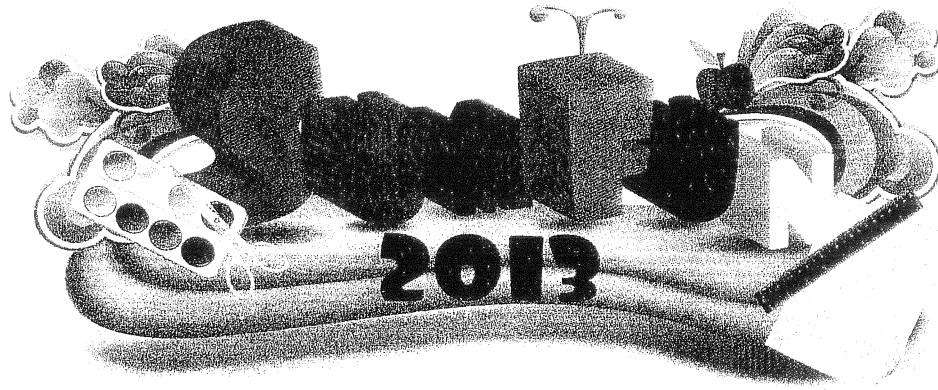

Welcome to the Zoo—Mrs. Shobert

Pre-K – Kdg. Class limit—20

Animal fun abounds everywhere in this action packed, fun-filled camp! Zoo songs, games, rhymes, stories, zebra marble painting, animal counting and more! Come be part of the fun!

Explore Japan—Mrs. Bloomfield

2nd-4th graders Class limit—20

Japanese Language & Culture Class - "Konnichi wa... O Genki Desu ka?" In this introduction to Japanese Language & Culture class, your student will learn basic phrases, songs, and simple dialogue in the Japanese Language. We will explore the differences in culture & how language displays those differences. We will also try different foods, listen to traditional Japanese music, watch a video (children's) on Japanese Language & Culture, and explore various Japanese arts. This class is designed to introduce the international interests of your student and expose them to a people group whose lifestyle is radically different than what they know. This is a highly interactive & engaging opportunity for your student.

Super Stamping—Mrs. Bordeaux

1st -4th graders Class limit—15

Join me at stamp camp and make your own fun cards for every occasion. We will learn different stamping techniques and apply them to projects so each day campers will leave with one or more cards to send to friends and family.

Investigating the iPad—Mrs. Bahorik

2nd-4th graders Class limit—15

I – Interact – Come experience hands on fun while acquiring basic knowledge of the iPad.

P- Produce – Learn ways the iPad can use your creativity to produce amazing projects

A – Apps – Learn from dynamic apps that you will never want to stop using!

D – Declare – Declare yourself an iPad expert by the end of this class!

Transportation Exploration—Mrs. Roberts and Miss Hauter

Pre-K – Kdg. Class limit—20

Cars, trucks, airplanes, boats! We will explore different things that GO and how they GO. What needs wheels? What needs wings? After designing and building our own planes, we will see whose will fly the farthest? After designing our own boats, we will see whose boat will sink or float? We will drive down these and other avenues as we explore transportation.

Fun with Water—Mrs. Roberts and Miss Hauter

Pre-K – Kdg. Class limit—20

We will have an exciting week filled with water play. We will be painting with water, mixing our own watercolor paints, and experimenting with water. We will be adding different substances to water to make new concoctions. We will see just how many ways we can play with water!

Learn with Lego's—Mr. Shobert

3rd-4th graders Class limit—22

Lego Camp will introduce students to key simple machine concepts while building teamwork and communication skills. Students will be investigating basic physical science concepts such as gears, pulleys, levers and wheels and axles through observation, reasoning, prediction and critical thinking—all while playing with Legos! Students will also learn to use Design Technology to transform everyday materials into imaginative creations based on children's literacy themes. Curriculum from LegoEducation.com.

Gardening 101—Mrs. Cynthia Domenghini (PCS parent)

1st-4th graders Class limit—15

In this interactive, play-based, gardening class participants will learn the basics of gardening. We will investigate critters that live in the garden, play with our food grown in the edible garden, create our own plants through propagation, and most importantly, HAVE FUN! Students will help establish a small garden on-site and will have the opportunity to bring plants home as well. During our exploration we will begin to understand God's intricate design of plants and how they can feed our healthy bodies.

Sporble Camp—Mr. Paris

1st-4th graders Class limit—20

What is Sporble Camp? It's a Sports camp and Bible camp combined! Sporble was designed to provide a vacation Bible school environment with an emphasis in sports. Each day the students will be challenged to grow spiritually and physically. Some of the events of the day will include singing, basketball, Bible time, soccer, and various other events. Each day a Bible lesson will be conducted and a weekly theme verse will be rehearsed. If your son or daughter is looking for a fun and active Bible camp this summer then Sporble Camp is the place to be!

Pottery—Mr. Jacob Grant (PCS parent)

1st-4th graders Class limit—16

Children will learn the basics of making pottery through hand-building and wheel throwing techniques.

May 28-31: Pinch Pots, Coil Pots, and Creating Crazy Clay Creatures

June 3-7: Slab Forms and Bird Houses or Other Small Animal Homes

(you do not need to sign up for both weeks)

Clay pieces made during the first half of the week will be fired so the children can glaze them on Friday. Whatever children cannot glaze (due to time constraints), will be glazed by us. Everything will be finish fired and ready for pickup no later than 2 weeks after the end of the camp.

Destination Discovery: The Magically, Delicious World of Science!—Mrs. Kellerstrass

1st-4th graders Class limit—20

Do you like to create and discover new things? Do you like magic tricks? How about making treats? If you answered yes to any of those questions, Destination Discovery could be for you! Join us this summer for a week filled with awesome science experiments and activities that will amaze your friends, stump your mom and dad, and even astound you! Crochet 101—Mrs. Shobert

3rd-4th graders Class limit—10

This camp is an introduction to the needlecraft of crochet. Beginning stitches such as chaining, single crochet, double crochet and half double crochet will be taught. An introduction to reading patterns will be given. Each student will receive a skein of yarn and one crochet hook (size I).

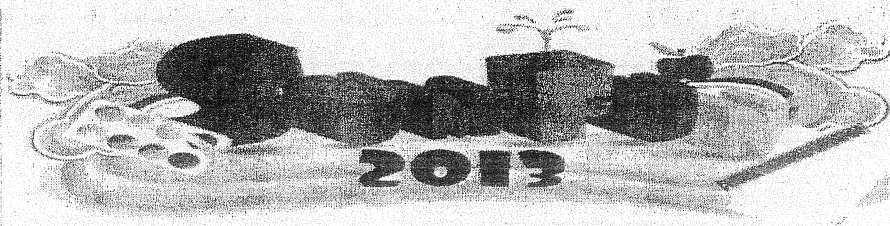
