The Lamb of God the Scarlet Thread



omeone has pointed out that Jesus Christ is like a scarlet thread that stretches from the Book of Genesis through the Book of Revelation. When one becomes familiar with the Old and New Testaments this is idea becomes self-evident. Of course, the scarlet thread stands for the thought that blood needs to be shed for the forgiveness of sins (Hebrews 9:22). As this theme progresses in the Old Testament the most perfect sacrifice for sin is embodied in the sacrifice of the lamb at Passover. Throughout the Old Testament the first born, year old lamb without blemish is the preferred sacrifice for sin. The idea of the first born of the flock starts with Abel in Genesis chapter four and finds its culmination in Jesus Christ who is identified by John the Baptist.

John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29 NIV).

What John meant by his statement was that Jesus would be the final manifestation of the sacrificial lamb. It would be Jesus who would once and for all take away the sin of humanity.

During Lent and Easter, we will explore this great theme. We will see how the Bible, the Old and New Testaments, progressively foreshadow and identifies Jesus as the One who would take on the role as sin bearer for humanity. The Lent and Easter Sermon Series-The Lamb of God



March 10, 2019 – The Lamb of God: The First Born of the Flock – Abel offers the first born of his flock as an offering for sin. It was not that the animal sacrifice was more acceptable to God than plant sacrifices. (Both are permitted in the Mosaic Law.) But, that Abel's sacrifice was given in faith!

<u>March 17, 2019</u> – **The Lamb of God: A Lamb Instead of Isaac** – The Lamb of God is a theme of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. In the Old Testament a lamb without blemish became the "thing" God used to atone for sin and make peace with Him. The sole heir of Abraham was Isaac, yet God required that Abraham sacrifice Isaac to show that he believed in God's promise. What did God do? He released Abraham from the test and provided a sacrifice instead.

<u>March 24, 2019</u> – **The Lamb of God: Death Passes Over and Does Not Stay** – The lamb reappears in the deliverance of Israel from captivity. Once again, the lamb is slain, its blood used as a sign to mark those who believed in God. Those who did not received a personal visit from death. The lamb caused the sins of the people not to be counted so that they could experience the salvation of God. In this case, the deliverance from Egypt.

March 31, 2019 – The Lamb of God: The Constant Sacrifice – Israel was told to sacrifice over and over again. The lamb was preferable, but other sacrifices would suffice, depending on the financial wherewithal of each person. The sacrifice would preferably be a male lamb without blemish. This of course points to something greater, because it is obvious the blood of sheep and goats could not eradicate sin once and for all. What was needed was a sacrifice which would remain constant for all time & eternity.

<u>April 7, 2019</u> – **The Lamb of God Who Takes Away the Sin of the World** – Now we see what all of the sacrifices pointed to, Jesus Christ. God obligated Himself to send His sole heir to make restitution for our sins. It was in Christ that an end to sacrifices would be made. It is by faith that each of us can receive the imputation of His sacrifice for us. In Christ God "passes over" our sins.

<u>April 14, 2019</u> – **The Lamb of God Enthroned** – When Jesus finished His work on the cross and after He had been raised from the dead, He ascended into heaven and was seated at the right hand of God. He purchased all sorts of people for eternal life. His work made Him worthy of our worship & praise. Since this is Palm Sunday, we will see that the praise of the people was not in vain, but actually portends the Risen, Exalted Lord.

<u>April 21, 2019</u> – **The Lamb of God Shall Conquer Sin & Death** – This is the final picture of what the Lamb has done and what He will do. The grave is empty, Christ has risen and is exalted. While we wait for His return we are to serve Him and during this time a window of grace is open for anyone who is thirsty for righteousness to come to Christ and receive the free gift of life.




