s we approach the 10 year anniversary of our disaffiliation from the PCUSA, we still find ourselves locked in a legal battle with our former denomination. Even though we have walked away from the property, given over all of our financial assets, our former friends continue to pursue legal action against us. What could be a worse crisis than that! 10 years of uncertainty, and a constant dripping of the dread that comes from such a situation.

What can we do about it? I think there are two things. Hold fast in faith and be obedient to fulfill our mission as a congregation of Jesus Christ! How do we do that? I think I can name it. Jesus never promised that our life as Christians would be easy all the time. As a matter of fact He said we would suffer if we followed Him. People would misunderstand us, oppose us, and make life difficult for us if we followed His teaching. But He also promised never to leave us nor forsake us!

An American Lutheran theologian by the name of Joseph Sittler once wrote about the suffering Christians must endure. He called it a "germinating darkness." It is that our life on earth is a place where our faith is tried and tested, and in that testing it becomes stronger and will eventually gleam with the brightness of pure gold (I Peter I:7). While the enemy means to use our fiery trials as-a-means-to destroy us, God always uses them to grow our faith! As Sittler pointed out, "If you completely wipe out the darkness, nothing can come forth and grow." So it is for seeds planted in the ground, in the darkness they burst forth with life.

Let's not be bewildered by these events, but instead, let's use this time to nurture the seeds of the Gospel so that they grow. When the church began on the Day of Pentecost, it started small, it grew without buildings. The reason it grew is because the people, who were themselves changed by the Grace of Jesus Christ, were faithful to share that same grace with others. They focused on the simple things of the Gospel, loving God and loving each other. They kept the basic principles. In other words, they made the main thing the main thing. That main thing is Jesus Christ and His saving Grace.

Paul told the Ephesians, "Be strong in the Lord and in the power of his might." (Eph. 6:10) To trust in the power of His might requires an active faith. The Bible gives at least three reasons to trust in God's

power: 1) God's past record, 2) our present situation and 3) God's desire that we trust Him.

For the first reason, the Bible tells us that even when people's faith was weak, God always fulfilled His promise to them. Sometimes people limited God's power to His physical presence. Like Mary did when she told Jesus, "Had you been here Lazarus would not have died." Jesus knew all along about Lazarus' condition and His intention was to heal him all along. His time was not Mary's timing. God is always working to bring about salvation, the Biblical record tells us that. Even Mary's unbelief in the face of the death of Lazarus did not keep lesus from fulfilling His mission.

The second reason we should trust in God's power is our present situation. Didn't Pharaoh pursue the Children of Israel until they had their backs to the sea? Didn't God deliver them? God bought them time and space. First, He put a great cloud between the armies of Egypt and Israel. Then He parted the Red Sea, the Israelites crossed over to safety while the armies of Egypt were held at bay by the cloud. Let's have faith.

The third reason that we can trust the power of God is that often He seems to come only in the nick of time to save His people. William Gurnall points out that Israel probably would never have left Egypt if people who remembered Joseph were still in power. If they left, it would not be because God delivered them, but because they chose to leave. With the tyrant Pharaoh, an ancient Kim Jong Un, God demonstrated His power. When God's people could not deliver themselves, God delivered them to His everlasting glory.

Let's focus on being obedient to the mission of Christ, love God and love others. That means living the way Jesus would have us live, loving each other, and deliberately sharing the Gospel with our community. It also means trusting the power of God's might. Even the darkness produces the work of God, not because the darkness has virtue in itself, but because God power makes it do His bidding.

On the last day of VBS, we offered Rita's Ice (instead of a full lunch) to parents and children. We received a number of grateful comments, notes, and also donations from pleased parents.
