

Music Helps "Release Sadness" and make you "Happy"

I often write about the benefits of music like singing in the choir, as a congregation, and as an individual. But a new study tells us that simply listening to music can have a profound effect.

The British Academy of Sound Therapy (BAST) has been studying the beneficial effects of listening to music for therapeutic purposes for years. They explained that "Most people hear or actively

listen to music every day and as humans we tend to change our playlists based on our mood." I can say with absolute certainty that in my case, music has a profound effect on how I deal with life's issues and helped me through the most trying time of my life.

To relax, the neuroscientists at BAST discovered that 13 minutes of music with a slow tempo and no lyrics was the optimum listening time. For happiness, it was about 9 minutes of upbeat music that helped people feel better and more in control of their life. And for sadness it was in the lyrics, the story in the song the person identified with that was key regardless of the style of music. We experience each of these discoveries in worship. Whether it's traditional or contemporary, the music is a mix of the slow, the upbeat, and the story-telling of scripture.

So, perhaps some specific choices of our music during this difficult time is in order. Take time to listen to various types and styles of music. Maybe turn off the news as I have over the past few weeks and tune in to music. Try the local radio stations or your internet connection, or your cable or satellite stations. There are many choices, find the right ones for you today.

Music defined: vocal or instrumental sounds (or both) combined in such a way as to produce beauty of form, harmony, and expression of emotion.

I'll see you, and hear you, "live" this Sunday. -Otis
