## *An Evening of Worship with Kody Kasey*

**Sunday, December 10, 2017 at 7:00 PM**

When Kody Kasey broke his right leg on a special teams play his sophomore season, many thought it would be easy for Kasey to overcome the injury and return to the football field.



However, that road to recovery was more difficult than imagined. After surgery to repair his broken leg, an infection grew that made it difficult for the leg to heal. Additional surgeries on the leg to fight the infection were not successful. That was when Kasey first thought of amputation, a year after the initial injury.

On November 16, 2015, surgeons removed Kasey's lower right leg, and he became a below-the-knee amputee.

After 2 months of rehab, on January 6, 2016, Kasey received his prosthetic leg. As he learned to walk and maneuver with his prosthesis, he once again focused on getting back on the football field. His determination and perseverance paid off, and today he is back on the field for the Georgetown College (KY) Tigers.
